ORDINANCE NO. 159

An Ordinance to amend Ordinance 153 of the Town of Nyssa Oregon, which was passed and approved on the 9th day of December, 1912, and which is entitled:

"An Ordinance to Regulate and Control the Use of the City Water, System, Including the Pump-house, Pumps, Settling Basin, Tank and Distributing System; to Regulate and Control the Manner of Making Connections with the Water Mains; Providing a fee for making Such Connections and Prescribing the Duty of the Town and its Officers in making such connections; creating the Office of Water Superintendent; Regulating and Providing Specifications for Plumbing; construction and Materials used; and providing for Inspection and condemnation of same on approval by an officer of the city; Fixing Rates and Tolls for the use of Water furnished by the town of Nyssa and Providing for a Method of collection, and making such charge a Lien upon the Property; Providing for a method of condemnation of inadequate or faulty Plumbing and connections; Locating Water Meters and Regulating the use thereof; and Providing a penalty for Interfering with, Altering, Breaking, or Tampering with, Stealing, Removing or destroying any Water Meter or the Water Main, Fire Plug or Hydrant, or Property of the town used in connection with the Nyssa Waterwork System; and containing an Emergency clause.

Section 2. Inasmuch as there is doubt as to a uniform fee for making water connections, and the manner and sufficiency of applications for connections, is hereby determined that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the Town of Nyssa, Oregon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and the Approval of the Mayor, and legal publication.

Passed by the Common Council

Section 1. That Sections 2 and 3 of said Ordinance No 153 of said Town of Nyssa be and the same is hereby amended to read as follows, to wit:

Section 2. All connections and taps made with or upon the water mains of the said town of Nyssa shall be made by the water superintendent whether the same be for domestic, irrigation, business, manufacturing purposes or otherwise. Before any connection is made the person, firm or corporation for whom same is to be made shall file with said water superintendent or the City Recorder, his, hers, or its application for such connection, which shall state; the purpose for which same is to be used; that water will be used for not less than one year from the date such connection may be made; the description of the property and premises upon which same is to be used; and which application shall be signed by the person, firm or corporation making such application. Blanks for said application are to be provided by the Water Superintendent or the City Recorder upon demand. Together with the said application, the said applicant shall tender and pay the amount of the fee for making the said connection in the amount hereinafter provided; the payment of said fee to be a condition precedent to the allowance

of any application for a connection, and shall be in payment of all materials, appliances, work, and labor of conveying the said water to the property line of the property described in said application for a connection; provided, however, that the town shall in no case make a connection upon said terms with property lying more than three hundred fifty feet (350) from a water main, except as otherwise provided. Provided further, that for property lying more than three hundred fifty feet from a water main the Town of Nyssa, Oregon, shall upon application and payment of the sum and fee hereinafter specified, furnish the necessary material, cocks and water meters and convey the said water for a distance of three hundred and fifty feet.

Section 3. There shall be a fixed fee of ten dollars for making all three-quarter inch connections with the water mains within the town, said fee to be paid in advance as hereinbefore provided. All connections larger than three-quarter inches shall be paid for by a fee greater than the said ten dollars and equal to the difference in the cost of the material and labor used; such additional amount to be determined by the water superintendent or by the Council and to be collected as as herein provided.

Section 2. Inasmuch as there is doubt as to a uniform fee for making water connections, and the manner and sufficiency of applications for connections, is hereby determined that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the citizens of the Town of Nyssa, Oregon, an emergency is hereby declared to exist, and this ordinance shall take effect, and be in full force and effect from and after its passage by the Common Council and the Approval of the Mayor, and legal publication.

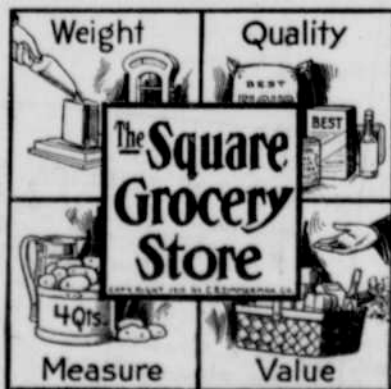
