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SCHOOL NOTES

The important doings at the special meeting of the Associated students of the Nyssa schools were the adoption of new amendments and the election of the permanent officers of the society. The gist of the new amendments is that a member must pay his annual dues before being allowed to vote; that he may pay an optional fee which entitles him to free admission to all doings given by the Associated students; that graduates and former students with a good record may become associate members by paying one dollar, which fee entitles them to practice with the teams. The new officers are: President, Elizabeth Canham; Vice-president, Blaine Gibson; Secretary-Treasurer, Lula Megorden; Sergeants-at-arms, Dewey Hoxie and Gertrude Fields; Student critic, Sylvester Morris.

The campus is taking on a more athletic air. The basket ball is being passed about over long reaches of territory and the passers are learning to travel with the ball. It is planned to erect the backstops within the next few days and then practice will begin in earnest. Acting in accordance with the power conferred upon him by the constitution, the principal has appointed Mr. Nedry manager of all athletic activities. The teachers are considering plans for participating in the corn carnival to be held at Ontario, November 11th and 12th.

At a recent meeting of the school board the subject of tuition for non-residents came up. For several years the number of non-resident students in the Nyssa schools has been steadily increasing. The board and patrons are glad that there are those around Nyssa who value so highly the superior advantages offered by this school. A careful study of the annual financial statement of the school district reveals the fact it costs about forty four dollars to school each pupil for a year. While the Nyssa school district is glad to have non-resident students in its school, it hardly seems fair that the local district should stand all the costs and that the district from which the pupil comes should get all the school money without making any return. Acting in accordance with a motion made at the last annual meeting, the board has decided to place the tuition at thirty dollars per annum. It is immaterial to the Nyssa district whether the tuition is paid by the parent or the school district from which the pupil comes. Many states by law provide that the district from which the pupil comes, shall pay for his tuition. Since the pupil's home district gets the school money from all resources, this seems to be a reasonable provision. A. H. VOEGELIN.
