SPEAKING OF OVERSUBSCRIPTIONS

The Journal congratulates heartily the good people of Vale on their accomplishments in the recent Red Cross campaign. We believe this work is and should be inspired by the loftiest patriotism, freed from all strife or contest. Our worthy contemporary, the Enterprise, has, however, seen fit to boast over the part his community did in the campaign. While we laud the natural feeling of pride that Vale's good work justly entitles them to, we believe the Enterprise has carried by comparison the results of his community to a point unfair to other communities, particularly Nyssa. For instance, in order to show Vale's subscription to be 917 oversubscribed, and to establish this as the highest percentage of oversubscription attained by any community in the county, he couples Nyssa and other communities. The Nyssa quota was \$1000, and the amount subscribed was \$2938, or an oversubscription of practically 200 per cent.
