Jack Lynch is in receipt of the following letter from William Thorpe, a former Nyssa boy:

Co. 1, 167 U. S. Army
Suizig Rhn, Germany,
Dec. 29, 1918.

Friend Jack—I am in the last place I ever thought of being—in Rhineland. We stepped here after walking thru Belgium and Luxemburg and say it was a darn hard hike to, when we got here our shoes were worn out and not much to eat.

After nine long months of hard fighting without a day's rest we sure enjoy a little time off. We wound up in the city of Sedan, France. That is a place that the French will always remember. It is where the Germans beat them in the war of 71.

Most many good comrades in this war, in fact most all that came over with me. My chances were very slim for a long time but was lucky and you know a man can use his head and save his life lots of times in a battle and I think I had a shade the best of it some times by being a little older than some of them. Only for the ones that came over last winter this thing would have possibly lasted four or five years yet. France and England would have fallen in July this year. I have seen very few boys from the states over here that I know.

There are some fine Fraulines here but it's bad for me like the rest that can't speak German. Once in awhile one can speak French and then I can get by. We all have rooms here in the village with the families some sleep on the floor but most of us have beds. I am staying with some fine people and they are pretty well to do, so eat with them most of the time. They are two Fraulines but are both old maids. There are lots of deer and wild bear here close in the woods so we have plenty of fine fresh meat and the Germans can sure cook. Had a swell dinner Xmas and one coming up New Year.
