FOR DEVELOPMENT

A meeting of the Malheur County development league was held in the office of the Nyssa Realty company on Tuesday evening and a good attendance from all parts of the county; interested in the developments of Malheur county's resources were present. TAKE WARNING

Don't let an unscrupulous promoter of some get-rich-quick oil, mining or other stock talk you into the notion of investing your Liberty Bonds or your War Savings Stamps in his proposition. The Associated Clubs of the World is sending out warnings against this sort of thing, and its investigation has disclosed that when a promoter or a stock salesman offers to take your government securities in exchange for his stock, his stock is worthless on the face of it. A new bulletin relating to this feature of the work of the sharks of this nature, says, "So far as we have been able to ascertain not a single case has ever been reported where promoters of a legitimate, worthy enterprise have offered to take Liberty Bonds in payment for the capital stock of a new company. We believe that the very offer to take these government securities should prompt the owner to consult a banker or a legitimate broker relative to the value of the stock that is offered in exchange for the bonds. The offer to exchange is an earmark which should serve as a warning." What is true of Liberty Bonds of course holds just as good for War Savings Stamps, and the danger to the holders of the smaller securities, the "baby bonds," is even greater, because they are usually less able to stand the loss of their hard-earned savings. Stick to your War Savings Stamps and they'll stick to you.
