## POISONING EFFECTIVE BUT BIRDS TOO WISE

The result of investigations by representatives of the U. S. Biological Survey as to the possibility of poisoning the crows which infest this part of the Snake River Valley, roosting by hundreds of thousands on Crow Island, proved rather disappointing. After baiting the birds with unpoisoned grain, treated to give it the taste of the poisoned preparation, for a couple of nights, then giving them the poisoned grain, it was found that the birds ate all of the unpoisoned preparation readily, but as soon as a few had been sickened by the poison which was given later, the others took warning. In two trials made at different times and in different places, the results were the same. About a half-dozen birds were killed, whereupon the others refused to eat the poison, though it lay on the ground for days where thousands of them passed over and about.

## OBITUARY
