The tree has been entered in the Hall of Fame of the American Forestry association of Washington.

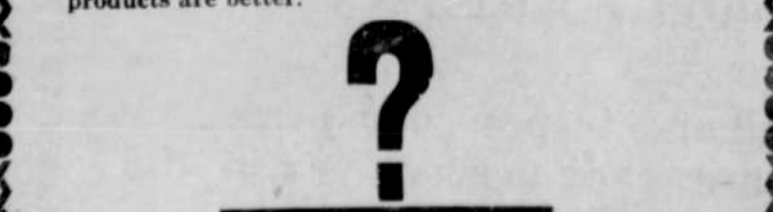
