Notice is hereby given that at the school district bond election hereby called to be held at the High School Building, Nyssa, Oregon, in and for school district No. 25 of Malheur county, Oregon, on the 8th day of May, A. D. 1920, between the hours of two o'clock p. m. and seven o'clock p. m. there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of \$24,500 for the purpose of constructing a school building and purchasing such additional real estate as may be necessary for school purposes in and for said district; the vote to be by ballot upon which shall be the words "Bonds—yes" and "Bonds—no," and the voter shall place a cross (x) between the word "Bonds" and the word "yes"; or between the word bonds and the word "no" which indicates his choice.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the contraction of said indebtedness will, on said day and date and at the place aforesaid, be opened at the hour of two o'clock p. m. and remain open until the hour of seven o'clock p. m. of the same day when the same shall be closed.

QUALIFICATION OF VOTERS.  
Any citizen of this state, male or female, who is twenty-one years of age and has resided in the district 30 days immediately preceding the meeting or election and has property in the district, as shown by the last county assessment, and not assessed by the sheriff, on which he or she is liable or subject to pay a tax, shall be entitled to vote at any school meeting or election in said district; provided, that the property qualifications imposed by this section shall not apply in the election of school directors and school clerks; provided further, that any person shall be deemed to have complied with the property qualification imposed by this section who presents to the directors or judges of election satisfactory evidence that he or she has stock, shares, or ownership in any corporation, firm, or copartnership which has property in the district, as shown by
