THE PICTURE SHOW---

The owner of a fine race horse in California wished to get pictures of his horse in every position as he ran around the race track. To do this he placed cameras all around the track with strings attached so that the horse in his rapid flight would strike the strings and leave a picture on the camera. Some genius conceived the idea of placing these pictures one after another and revolving them rapidly, thus creating the impression of one continuous moving picture.

Such, if we are properly informed, was the origin of the moving picture, one of the greatest inventions of the age.

All pictures are interesting and attractive, especially so to the young, but when they are made to move, endowed with life as it were, they are ten-fold more attractive. Teachers, preachers, parents, boys, and girls cannot hold back the boys and girls from the picture show. It takes the place of the school and the church. To the movie, they are bound to go, and with them their nickels, dimes, dollars and all their savings. The Pied Piper of Hamelin with his inspired music could not draw with greater power. It is estimated that from four to six million people in the U. S. attend the movies every day and night.

The moving picture show is one of the greatest evils in our society for it teaches evil. A power for good when the pictures are properly censored and the shows properly controlled; a power for evil when not properly censored and controlled.

Many a man and woman, after seeing pictures of the crimes committed by the Germans, left the picture show resolved to do, and do it, necessary to win the World War. Who knows how many anarchists, I. W. W.'s and foreigners left other picture shows, not properly censored, inspired to do what they could to destroy our country? It is a well known fact that most foreigners, and many of our own people too, get most of their education and "spiritual" training at the picture shows. It is here they get to thinking, and "as they think in hearts so are they."

They seldomarken a church door or any place where the moral and spiritual welfare is cared for, if they can possibly get to a picture show or some place of amusement.

We say the World War is over, and yet we have a "Great War" in our own minds.

What shall we do? We as a people seem to have lost sight of the fact that man is a three-fold being. We have been looking after the physical, or material, and intellectual, to the almost utter neglect of the spiritual, that part which raises man above the brute and allies him to God.
