### SALVATION ARMY TO MAKE BOYS FARMERS

Neglected Youngsters to Be Given Thorough Training in Mechanics of Farming.

With thorough appreciation of the value to the state of trained agriculturists, versed in modern methods and with a knowledge of applied mechanics necessary to modern farming, the Salvation Army in its Home Service Program for Oregon, plans to make useful farm hands, if not farm experts, of many neglected and dependent youngsters. Throughout the state there are always lads whose ages range from seven and eight to fifteen years, who will have no future apart from poverty and comparative ignorance and probable criminality. Opportunities such as these to be offered by the Industrial and Agricultural school the Salvation Army plans to establish at North Yamhill, on the 100 acre farm on which now stand the buildings of the Bishop Scott school, will open before these lads a useful life.

Brought up to manhood in clean surroundings, with daily instruction in ordinary schooling and practical instruction and practice in farming, the youngsters will not only be saved from bad citizenship but given an honorable profession or trade with which to earn their own way as men.

At the Yamhill school, to be patterned after the famous Lytton school conducted by the Salvation Army in California, both boys and girls will find all the essentials of preparation for life's battle. The girls will be taught sewing, household duties, cooking etc. The boys will be trained in several trades and in farming, horticultural and animal husbandry pursuits and modern farm mechanics.

And while their bodies and minds are being trained their responsibilities as citizens and members of society will not be neglected in fact, one of the strongest teachings of the Salvation Army is Americanism. The school is non-sectarian.

Through the efforts of the Salvation Army in Portland, several boys have been taken from up state Oregon towns and placed at the California farm school temporarily until the funds made available by the financial campaign, May 1 to May 10, provide for the opening of the Yamhill school. County advisory boards in every county in Oregon are helping the Salvation Army in this great work with children.

### MALHEUR COUNTY'S QUOTA IS \$3,300

The "citizens' division" quota for Malheur County in the united simultaneous campaign of the churches cooperating in the Interchurch World Movement has been set at \$3,300.00. The citizens' division state quota is \$230,000. This sum is the total for the general campaign, and in addition to the denominational quotas, several of which already have been announced. The campaign will be directly in the hands of the Interchurch County Director for this County.

This does not comprise a budget for the Interchurch Movement as an organization. The subscriptions to this fund are to be divided among the cooperating churches. In the coming united simultaneous campaign memberships of the various cooperating churches will be asked for millions of dollars to carry on work which is not of a denominational character, but is for the good of society in its broadest sense.

"The citizens of the country who have the good of the social order at heart will be asked to contribute also through this citizens' division," said the county campaign director, "not for the benefit of any one denomination, not even for the advancement of the established churches from the narrow point of view, but to the end of bringing better, more wholesome conditions throughout the world. For hospitals, schools, missionary centers, welfare work in backward industrial fields. The program of the churches cooperating in the Interchurch World Movement is more than a 'Christian' program in its ordinarily accepted sense as applying to particular religious denominations. It is a humanitarian movement—Christianity in its broadest sense."

### SCHOOL DISTRICT BOND ELECTION NOTICE

STATE OF OREGON,

SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 26.

Notice is hereby given that at the school district bond election hereby called to be held at the High School Building, Nyssa, Oregon, in and for school district No. 26 of Malheur county, Oregon, on the 8th day of May, A. D. 1920, between the hours of two o'clock p. m. and seven o'clock p. m. there will be submitted to the legal voters thereof the question of contracting a bonded indebtedness in the sum of \$24,500 for the purpose of constructing a school building and purchasing such additional real estate as may be necessary for school purposes in and for said district; the vote to be by ballot upon which shall be the words "Bonds—yes" and "Bonds—no," and the voter shall place a cross (x) between the word "Bonds" and the word "yes"; or between the word bonds and the word "no" which indicates his choice.

The polls for the reception of the ballots cast for or against the contraction of said indebtedness will, on said day and date and at the place aforesaid, be opened at the hour of two o'clock p. m. and remain open until the hour of seven o'clock p. m. of the same day when the same shall be closed.

### QUALIFICATION OF VOTERS.

Any citizen of this state, male or female, who is twenty-one years of age and has resided in the district 30 days immediately preceding the meeting or election and has property in the district, as shown by the last county assessment, and not assessed by the sheriff, on which he or she is liable or subject to pay a tax, shall be entitled to vote at any school meeting or election in said district; provided, that the property qualifications imposed by this section shall not apply in the election of school directors and school clerks; provided further, that any person shall be deemed to have complied with the property qualification imposed by this section who presents to the directors or judges of election satisfactory evidence that he or she has stock, shares, or ownership in any corporation, firm, or copartnership which has property in the district, as shown by the last county assessment, and not assessed by the sheriff, on which such corporation, firm, or copartnership pays a tax, even though his or her individual name does not appear upon the tax roll.

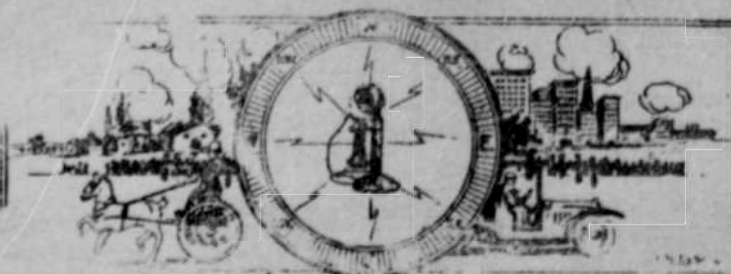
