DENY PROPOSAL TO CANCEL ALLIED DEBTS

Washington.—No proposal has been made to the United States by the allies for the cancellation of their debts to this government or suggesting that their payment be made contingent upon the payment to them of reparations by Germany. This was reiterated by treasury officials in commenting on cable reports indicating that the subject had been under discussion at allied conferences.

Regardless of what the views of administration officials might be, congressional action would be required for any action of this nature.

The secretary of the treasury in deferring the interest payments on certain of the allied debts, is acting within limitations under the loan acts of congress beyond which the administration cannot go, whether it so desires or not.

WOMEN'S HATS NECESSITIES

Milliners. Subject to Prosecution for Profiteering, Says Official.

Washington.—Women's hats, plain or adorned, are necessities of life under the meaning of that term as used in the Lever act, Howard Figg, special assistant to the attorney-general, has ruled.

Mr. Figg's ruling was in reply to an inquiry to the National Retail Milliners' association as to whether women's hats come within the range of the act under which the department of justice is authorized to prosecute for profiteering in necessities.

Breakstuffs Exports Increase.
Washington.—Breakstuffs exported in May amounted to \$99,000,000 or an increase of about \$3,000,000 over the same month last year. Exports of meat and dairy products, valued at \$51,000,000, showed a decrease of \$42,000,000 from May, 1919. It was announced by the department of commerce.

21 Baptist Delegates Injured.
Buffalo, N. Y.—Twenty-one delegates attending the Northern Baptist convention were injured in the collapse of a wooden structure upon which more than 500 persons were standing to have a group photograph taken. None of the injuries is considered serious.

**Wants Boats
From Nyssa
Nampa Ferry**

**aldwell Man Says There
In Tonnage Galore and
Line Would Pay Big at
\$1 a Ton.**

Will a line of freight boats between Nyssa and Nampa Ferry pay? Many persons who are acquainted with the country to be served and the tonnage to be secured believe it would. Among them are B. W. Rice of Caldwell, who writes the Boise Statesman as follows: "Passing through the Snake river region 10 and 15 miles west from Caldwell yesterday, we made note of the immense tonnage of spuds and grain and grain that must be hauled at the state, and we also saw the shorted railroad lines. This letter is intended to reach some young promoters who will put on a line of freight boats between Nampa Ferry and Nyssa, Or. In order to handle this tonnage it will be necessary to have our boats of 50 tons capacity. A boat can leave Nampa Ferry or any intermediate point and drop down to Nyssa in 10 hours, carrying 50 tons of spuds. It can work its way up the river at a speed of three miles per hour and thus make a round trip every 24 hours. It will cost \$1 per ton for this transportation and the damage done to potatoes and fruit, etc., will not be half so much as a truck ride over the roads."

It might be that the Short Line would give as good rate from Home Dale as from Nyssa, or so nearly the same that the river boats would not need to go below Henedale. A 50 horse power gas engine will do the work on a boat of this size, and as a matter of fact the actual cost per ton for the haul will not exceed 50 cents and the other 50 cents will be gain for the promoters. I believe the farmers will sign up for a five years' job. The river will handle this boat nicely. There is tonnage enough to earn \$20,000 each season and there is much back-loading. All the region from Houston can go to the river on a wagon haul of three or four miles. All along the banks of the river there is tonnage galore. A 1 mile haul down hill to the river is less than a two mile haul up hill from the river. B. W. RICE."
