**Sunday Closing  
Law Condemned**

Upon this question of the Rights of All Men there has been continued controversy ever since men were upon earth.

Cain was not content to worship God as he chose. He was not satisfied unless he could control his brother's conscience as well. That desire to control the conscience of another in the worship of God, led to the first murder.

When men seek to force others to worship God, or to observe religious institutions, are they not following the same course which Cain traveled? And if persecution and murder was the result of Cain's effort to force his religion and manner of worship upon his brother, then, will not a similar course have disastrous results today?

Many people, since the days of the first murder, have been possessed of the spirit to rule over men in religious concerns. They seem to think it is their duty to do so.

Christian religion flourishes best where there is the most perfect recognition of the inherent rights of men.

True religion, and religious institutions need no human laws to make them shine brightly. The gospel is not made sweeter nor more attractive by fines and imprisonment.

The right to choose, each for himself, is one of the dearest and most sacred ever given to men. We can not believe—not for a moment—that any true American desires to support any system which robs men of their God-given liberties, and results in persecution and acts of violence against conscience and sincere citizens.

Sunday closing involves more than hours of pleasure and recreation. It involves more than gain which may be secured by operating a movie. A vital principle of our Great Republic is involved; and when religion is enforced by civil law, or religious observances are demanded of the least citizen, an attack is thereby made upon the very foundation of our government.

Nor can it be truthfully said that majorities have a right to rule in these matters. Our government is civil, and was never ordained to enforce religion, religious institutions or doctrines. Ours is a government of law, and not of men, as are most other governments of the old world and of history. Our constitution is our supreme law, with which every law of the nation and of every hamlet of the nation must harmonize.

"Congress shall make no law respecting an establishment of religion nor prohibiting the free exercise thereof," is a most sacred part of our Federal Constitution. Does the enactment of a Sunday closing ordinance harmonize with this?

In purely civil matters, law-making bodies must decide; but in things spiritual, no man, or combination of men, have the least shadow or right to decide, even for the least citizen, when his conduct does not invade an equal right of his neighbor.

That business which is civil and operated on Monday cannot be interfered with or justly closed on any day of the week by any law for religious reasons.

Any business which is moral on Monday, is moral on every day of the week in the eyes of just civil government.

Men do refrain, because of religious convictions, from engaging in businesses on certain periods of time; but they should not enforce business upon the other fellow by civil law. Our American supreme law prohibits this. That which is truly American is in harmony with the constitution of America; and of course, that which is not in accord with our great American constitution must be un-American.
