ARRANGING TO IMPORT DAISY STOCK

The Farm Bureau has plans well under way to bring to the importation of daisy stock for the benefit of the farmers of the county. These plans contemplate the placing of cattle which are fully inspected for disease and approved as to quality by the dairy specialist of the college. The stock will be kept at the minimum so as to place the cattle on the farms at practically what they cost. The whole matter will be handled by men approved as competent and reliable by the Bureau committee.

The live stock situation in Malheur county has been the subject of much debate in the meetings of the Farm Bureau executive committee for months. With an ever increasing demand for coarse feeds on the farms of this section, accompanied by a constantly increasing demand from range livestock, the problem of in-

creasing the numbers of dairy cattle has come to be one of the most important. The Bureau as one of its first duties certain returns on its investment of any form of stock on is capable of producing a yield of 50 pounds of milk per cow per month.
