Incas' Marvelous Dye.
Garments of the Incas, dyed with indigo before Columbus discovered America, have been found in ancient tombs in Peru, according to Doctors M. A. Velasquez and A. Maldonado of Lima. The blue dye has not even begun to fade.

To Restore Faded Ink.
When the ink of old documents has faded and it is desired to restore it, this can be done by washing with any of the substances that blacken on mixing with iron—infusion of nutgalls, sodium-sulphide, or acetic ferro-cyanide of potassium, for instance.

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Atmosphere Above Earth's Surface.
The atmosphere is believed to extend much more than 100 miles above the earth's surface. Its density decreases rapidly for the first few miles of ascent, then much more gradually. From the phenomena of twilight, due to refraction of light, it may be demonstrated that the air extends up to a height of 45 miles; but other phenomena, such as the behavior of meteors and the aurora, show that rare air exists at a much greater height.
