NYSSA SCHOOL NOTES

In last Friday's baseball games, the 4th grade defeated the 3rd 3rd grade and the 7th won over the 6th grade. Both games were hotly contested.

The local declamatory contest has been postponed till Monday, March 21, when it will be held in the High School assembly room. There will be a charge of 15 cents.

In a survey of schedules of subjects of High school students in 225 standard High Schools in Oregon State Superintendent Churchill found that more students were studying in Algebra than any other subject with total of 8292. English I follows a close second with 7750. Some of the other totals are: English II, 5667; General Science, 4196; Latin I, 3080; Sociology, 30; Plumbing, 5; Engineering, 2; German, 1.

John Straub dean of men at the University of Oregon, plans to visit the High School soon, when he will talk to all the upper grades and High School students.

Entrance salaries for elementary teachers in New York city are \$1500 and \$1900, the first for teachers of the kindergarten and the first six grades, the second for teachers of the 7th and 8th grades. The \$1500 salary increases by an annual increment of \$125 to a maximum of \$2875. The \$1900 salary increases by an annual increment of \$150 to a maximum of \$3250.

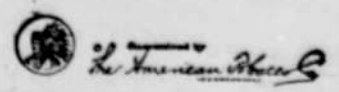
