### THE WHITE MAN'S BURDEN

#### Economy Like Charity Should Begin at Home

Practically every Western state is facing for this year the greatest tax bill on record. In many instances, the tax has been doubled and tripled in the past six years. Industry will be called upon to pay this burden and there is no way to get out of it, for the bill has been contracted.

The people are largely to blame for the present state of affairs and they will get no relief until by their voice expressed at elections they have the courage to demand tax reduction and hold public officials to campaign pledges for economy.

Further, the citizen must get out and vote for men and measures which guarantee economy. If this is not done our tax burdens will grow until it will take special deputies to hunt down individuals and confiscate their property, if they have any, to meet the tax bills. This is not an exaggerated picture.

That the power to tax is the power to destroy has been already well illustrated and taxation today is the greatest single item which prevents and will prevent a return to pre-war conditions. Inasmuch as we have an enormous war bill to pay in addition to our other taxes, it is all the more necessary that a reduction in local taxrolls be demanded and secured.
