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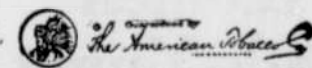

WEEVIL PARASITES LIBERATED IN PAYETTE COUNTY

Steps were taken last week to control the alfalfa weevil, when a box of the parasites were released in the Fruitland district. The parasites are small Ichneumon flies which attack the larvae of the weevil and prevent its further development.

This parasite was brought from Europe and introduced in the vicinity of Salt Lake, in 1912. At the present time it is found in Utah and Eastern Idaho, and it is desired to have it introduced into all weevil infested sections.

The parasite passes the winter in the pupal stage, emerging in the spring to lay eggs inside the body of the weevil larvae. The eggs later hatch, forming another larvae, which kills the weevil larvae at the time it spins the pupal web, thus preventing it from transforming to an adult. There is no danger of the new insect becoming a pest, as it can only live on the weevil.

The new fly multiplies fast, as is evidenced by its rapid spread in Eastern Idaho. So it should only be a short time before they will become an important factor in alfalfa weevil control.—New Plymouth Sentinel.

BEEKEEPING IS DEVELOPING

Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis, July 28.—Beekeeping as an occupation is rapidly developing in size in the irrigated sections of eastern Oregon, and in the alkali cover section of the Willamette valley.

Many beekeepers have incomes of from \$1500 to \$4,000 while some have an income from their apiaries which is more than \$10,000. The present production of honey in Oregon is nearly 1,000,000 pounds. Beekeeping is being constantly increased due to larger areas coming under irrigation.
