WOULD PUT UP SIGNS ONEVERGREEN HIGHWAY

A delegation of boosters for Weiser, Payette and New Plymouth, composed of Geo. Waters, Lyle Wood and J. H. Hughes of Weiser, and R. B. Fitch, of Payette, representing towns on the Evergreen Highway were in town Monday for the purpose of securing the co-operation of Parma together with other towns on the Oregon Trail Highway, Notus, Nyssa, and Ontario, in putting up a sign on Canyon Hill.

They propose a V shaped sign, one side giving name and emblem of the Evergreen Highway with the distance to each town between Canyon Hill and Weiser, the other side giving the name and emblem of the Old Oregon Trail Highway with the distance from Canyon Hill to each town from there to Weiser.

The pine tree has been chosen as the Evergreen emblem and Ezra Meeker with his ox team seems to be the popular choice of the Old Oregon Trail highway.

The plan of so co-operating met with favor with the men of Parma

who were gathered at the Baldridge implement store for a conference on the subject and E. T. Rice, secretary of the Association of Commerce, was delegated to go with the visitors to look of the site proposed.

It is the consensus of opinion, however, of the people in Parma that it would be well to wait until the two roads are officially mapped out before we take any definite action in this matter as the sign will be of little benefit to us and our only reason for entering into it at all was to show the proper spirit of friendly co-operation.—Parma Review.

Anyid seased potato plants, sickly, weak or otherwise unsatisfactory, should be dug out, taken off the field and destroyed as promptly as they appear. If this measure is followed through the season it will help materially in preventing spread of potato disease.

ALFALFA WEEVEL TESTS

FIGURES SHOW EXTENT OF EXPERIMENTS IN DESTROY-DEVASTATING INSECTS.

The effectiveness of calcium arsenate liquid spray for killing the alfalfa weevil larva or worms may be judged to some extent from the following counts made on June 1 at the Homer Utley place on the tract which was used for a spraying demonstration on June 2 and was partly re-sprayed on June 11, giving the five combinations listed below:

Treatment	Hay Received	No. Worms in Ten Sweeps of Net
Sprayed June 2, double application	110	
Sprayed June 2, single application	260	
Sprayed June 2 and again June 11	300	
Sprayed June 11, single application	550	
Not sprayed	1100	

These figures are not entirely consistent with respect to the effect of the second application and it may be said that the count was made too

early to get the full value of the second spraying. It takes a week or longer for the benefits to show up well as the worms die slowly and the new growth is slow. However, a comparison of the number of worms on the area sprayed double on June 2 with that which was not sprayed shows a 90 per cent kill. The hay shows the result as well as the figures do for that which was sprayed is of good color, is growing again and beginning to bloom. The unsprayed hay is practically eaten up except the stems and would make a very light yield of very poor stuff. Figures on the yield will be taken and made available to the public a little later.

Overcuring Spoils Hay.

Much good hay is spoiled each year by being left too long in the swath, winnow or shock. A very much better quality of baled hay or loose may be had by curing the hay out as rapidly as possible and putting it in the mow or stack where it is not exposed to light. It may then be baled up with better moisture content and better color.
