Farm News Notes

A. G. Sanford, president of the Central Oregon Beekeeper's association, visited the agricultural college in the interest of the beekeepers. He was formerly president of the Oregon State Beekeeper's association. He remained on the campus for the Hort show and the fruit growers' convention meetings.

Ordering queen bees for early delivery is advisable at this time, as the queen supply is limited.

Land foul with weeds, crop remnants, or bunches of grass and sod particularly inviting to insects as a breeding ground. Here the majority of our injurious cutworms, meadow maggots and wireworms occur. If the fields are thoroughly cleaned it will do much to prevent serious infestation of such pests.

A cold, wet hen needs her food to warm up and dry her feathers instead of for egg production. If the birds are kept only for egg production, better results will be obtained if they are confined, providing proper management is carried out by properly feeding them to make them exercise and keep busy. Out one day and confined the next does not make a satisfied, contented hen. Contentment tends toward egg production.
