John Boston made a business trip to Boise last week.

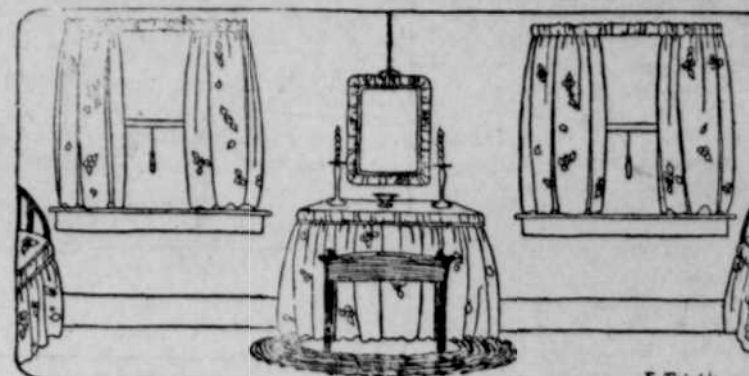
C. Smith, who is feeding cattle on Willow creek, was a visitor here this Monday.

A. McWilliams of Ontario, was a business visitor here Saturday.

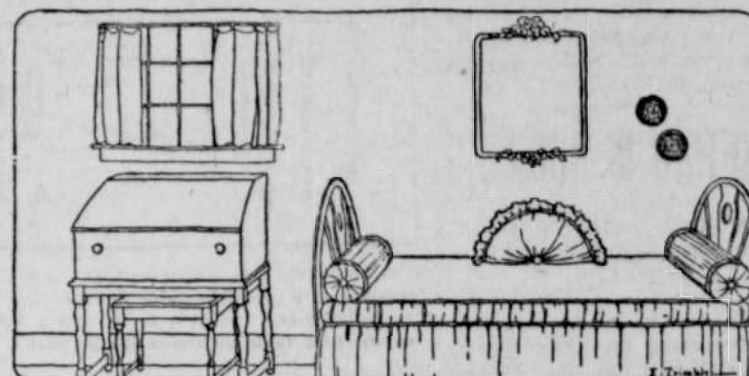

## 'THIS DAINTY BEDROOM AT LITTLE EXPENSE



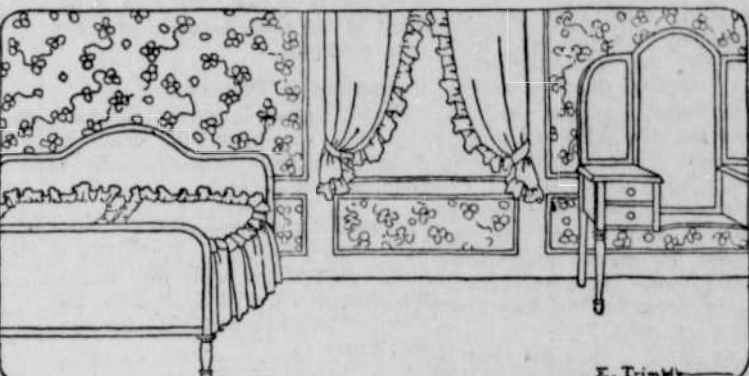
The dainty bedroom pictured here may be duplicated at little expense by any housewife who is clever with her needle. Pale green chintz scattered with apple blossoms drapes the packing-box dressing table, the black enamel bow-foot bed, and forms the window draperies. The black bench which may be bought secondhand, is upholstered with the chintz; the beds may also be bought secondhand and enameled. A shirring two inches wide with a cord in each edge is used across the tops of the windows, around the edge of the beds and the dressing table, and to cover the mirror frame. The dressing table top is covered with a piece of the chintz, over which ordinary window glass is fitted. The hand-branded rug is made of the scraps of the chintz with a deep border of black. The candlesticks and powder dish are of rose-colored glass and the candles and mirror cord are also rose.

## THIS SERVES AS COZY CORNER GUEST ROOM



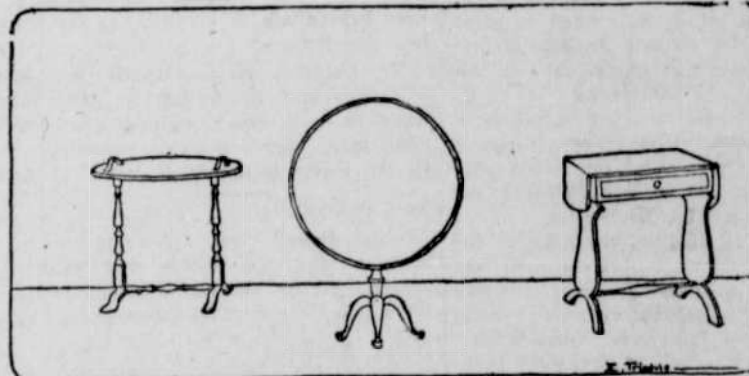
This corner of an apartment living room serves as a guest room, and a very convenient corner it is at times. The day bed pulls out to double its ordinary size and a supply of bedding is folded up inside. Two bed pillows are rolled up inside the end cushion covers which fasten with large snaps down one side. When opened up the desk is a complete little dressing table, with a good-sized mirror, which can be drawn out and set up when one is dressing. A gay painted screen hides this corner when it is not in use.

## DO NOT USE TOO MUCH CRETONNE IN ROOM



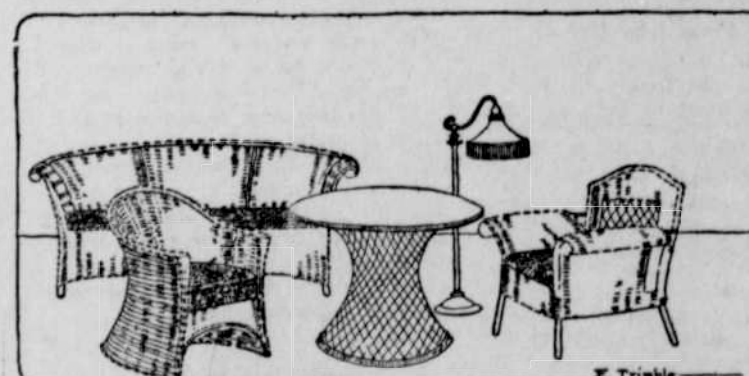
Cretonnes are good, but do not overdo them is the advice of the interior decorators. In a room with a figured wall covering or a patterned rug, even a very attractive cretonne strikes a wrong note. ## THESE TABLES WILL BE FOUND VERY USEFUL



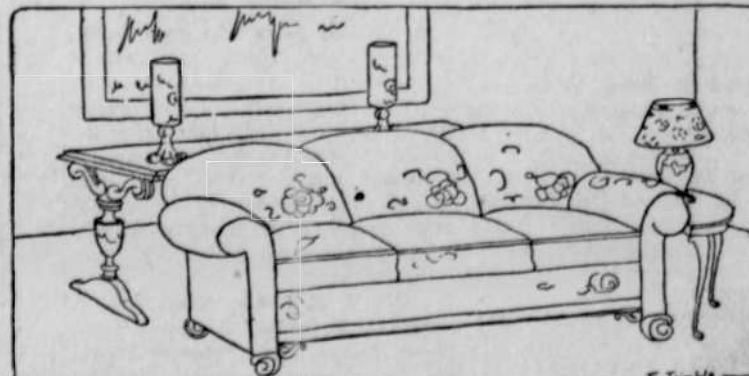
