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Leake Entertainers Please Audience

The following regarding the Leake Entertainers, who will give an entertainment in Nyssa on the evening of October 23, is an excerpt from the Wisconsin Green Bay Press-Gazette, and gives an idea of the quality of their performance:

"It is doubtful if a more pleasing program could have been selected for the opening of Chautauqua than that presented last evening. Leake's Orchestral Entertainers revealed a versatility of ability that won the hearty applause and approbation of the large audience. H. J. Leake exhibited an ability so startling in its variety and so pleasing in its quality that he was a star of the evening. His wonderful work on the xylophone included selections ranging from the Post and Peasant, Overture by Von Suppe, to popular songs and the beautiful "Home, Sweet Home," a four stick number, was heartily applauded.
