To the Honorable County Court of Said County and State.

The undersigned being more than 50 per cent of the acreage of the contiguous body of alkali, wet and overflow lands in Malheur County, State of Oregon, hereinafter described, do hereby petition your honorable body to cause to be organized a drainage district for the purpose of having such lands reclaimed and protected from the effects of water, for sanitary and agricultural purposes and for the convenience and welfare of the public utility and benefit; and for the purpose of this petition we state the following matters as required by Chapter 40 of the General Laws for Oregon for the year 1915.

1. The name proposed for such drainage district is: Owyhee Drainage District.

2. The boundary lines of the proposed District are as follows:

Beginning at the northeast corner of Section 35, in Township 20 South, Range 46 east of the Willamette Meridian, in the County of Malheur, State of Oregon; running thence south to the north bank of the Owyhee river; thence in a southwesterly direction along the north bank of said Owyhee river to a point where said north bank of said river intersects the south boundary line of said Section 35; thence west along the south boundary line of said Section 35 to the southwest corner of said Section; thence north along the west boundary line of said Section 35 to the northwest corner of said Section; thence east along the north boundary line of said Section 35 to the northeast corner of said Section, which is the place of beginning.

3. The total acreage included in the said proposed District is 602.6 acres.

4. The names of the owners of the lands within said proposed District, as shown by the records of said Malheur County, State of Oregon; and the acreage owned by each of said owners is as follows:

5. The proposed reclamation and protection of said lands is for sanitary and agricultural purposes; and such reclamation and protection will be conducive to the public health and welfare, and of public utility and benefit.

6. All the lands included in said proposed District are properly included therein, and will be beneficially affected by the operation of the proposed District.

7. The benefits of such proposed reclamation and protection will exceed the damage to be done; and the best interests of the land included and of the owners of such lands as a whole and the public at large, will be promoted by the formation and proposed operation of said District.

8. The formation of the drainage District, under the provisions of Chapter 340 of the General Laws of Oregon for 1915, under the provisions of which this petition is proposed, is a proper and a advantageous method of accomplishing the reclamation and protection of the land within the proposed District.

9. The proposed plan for the reclamation and protection of the property and lands in the proposed District is by system of tile drains properly designed and located to carry off waste, seepage and drainage water.

The land included in the proposed drainage District is so situated that without ditches and tile drainage being constructed and laid, and the waste, seepage and drainage water drained off, the said lands will remain cold, sour and unprofitable for agricultural purposes.

10. The signers of this petition agree that they will pay any and all expenses incurred, and any tax or taxes that may be levied against their respective lands for the purpose of paying the expense of organizing, or attempting to organize the said proposed District, said expense to be taxed against the lands of the signers hereto in proportion to the number of acres owned by them and affected by the proposed drainage.

11. WHEREFORE, your petitioners pray: that the lands described herein, or such of them as may be found by the Court to be properly included within the proposed drainage District, either permanently or until further investigation and surveys may permit elimination, shall be declared organized into a drainage District, under provisions of Chapter 340 of the General Laws of Oregon for the year 1915, and any and all amendments thereto.

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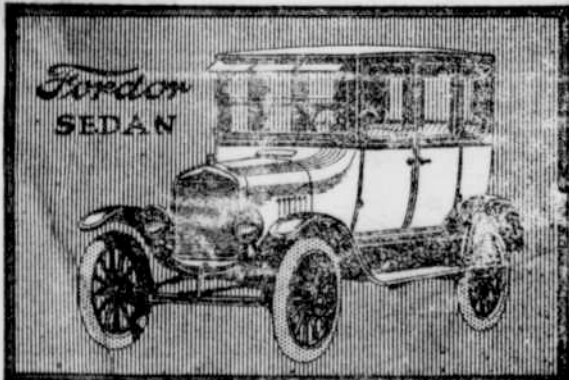
