Blodgett to Portland

E. M. Blodgett is in Portland this week representing Nyssa at a meeting of the Interstate Commerce Commission. A hearing is to be given at this meeting to an application from the business men of the Snake river valley to have an order issued compelling the railroad company to extend its line from Crane, Oregon, to Kirk, Oregon, thereby making connection with the Southern Pacific and shortening the rail distance to San Francisco by 400 miles. This movement has the backing of the state utilities commissions of Oregon, Idaho and California, together with practically all the civic organizations of the state.

The distance of line to be built is only about 170 miles, with almost level ground all the way. That this road will be built and in operation within a very short time is a foregone conclusion.

Miss Kennedy Resigns

At a meeting of the school board Saturday the resignation of Miss Louise Kennedy as superintendent of schools was accepted. 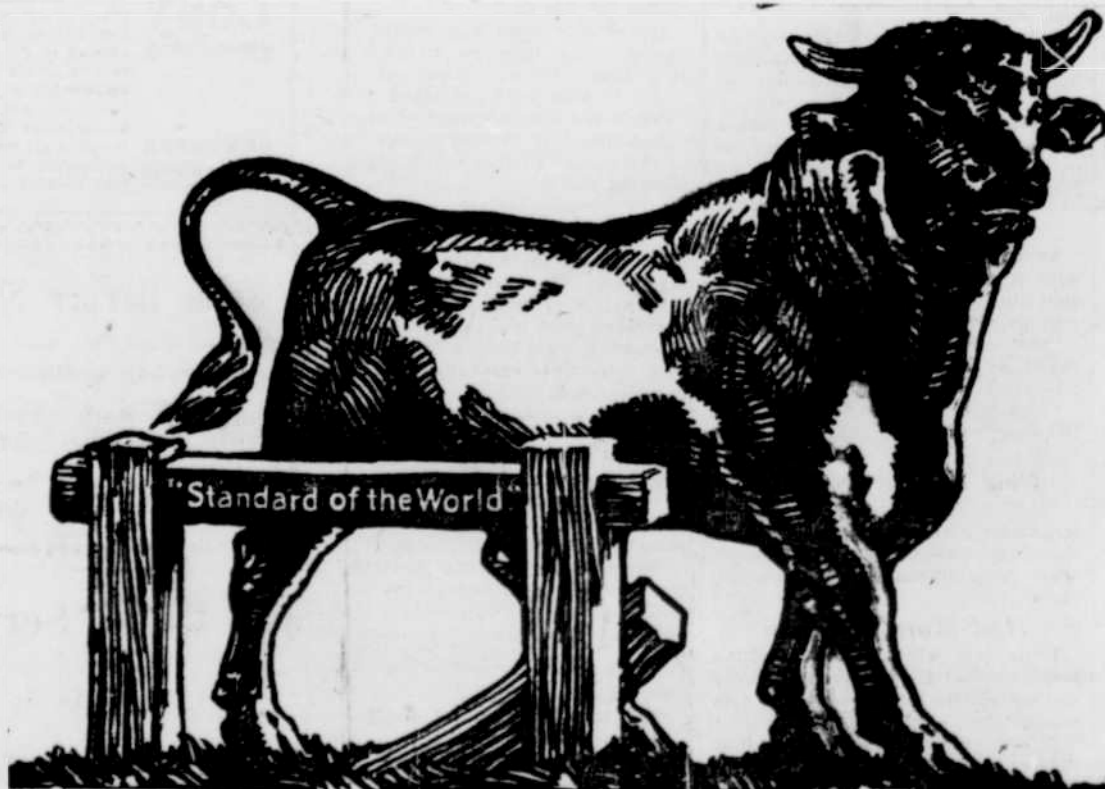
