McNary Killed

Mrs. William McNary, wife of a man declared by officers to be one of the most notorious bootleggers in Central Oregon, shot her husband fatally at their home near Bend, Oregon, April 4, after he had threatened to kill her, according to the sheriff.

McNary was engaged in a quarrel with a man known to the woman as "Claudie." He escaped from the house, McNary following shooting at him with a rifle. Mrs. McNary fled from the house, the husband pursuing till she turned and shot. McNary formerly lived in the Owyhee district, where he had considerable reputation as a bad man. On one occasion he pulled a gun on Deputy Sheriff Glenn while resisting arrest. The hammer luckily fell on a defective cartridge which failed to explode.
