Portland Saves 8000 German Babies

Portland people in two weeks subscribed \$24,000 toward relief for German children, who are included in the millions in Germany who face starvation because, as Herbert Hoover expressed it, of the economic breakdown, following the world war.

As the American committee for relief of German children has shown it costs two cents per meal to feed a child one hot meal daily in Germany. This means that the people of Portland have saved 8000 children for 150 days.

"We never fought children," said Major-General Allen, head of the nation-wide relief campaign, and the people are showing they support his declaration. The state-wide campaign for this relief work is getting nicely under way, too, with a good response from the people everywhere.

Noted Army Chaplain Pleads for Babies

Rev. Dr. John W. Beard, pastor of the Mount Tabor Presbyterian church, Portland, chaplain of Portland post of the American Legion and chaplain of one of the companies of the famous 91st Division overseas, is a strong champion of the campaign to save German children from starvation and never loses an opportunity to say something for that cause.

"We fought and conquered the German militarists," said the noted chaplain, "but, as Major-General Henry T. Allen, commander of the American troops on the Rhine during the occupation, said, 'We never fought children.' We helped win the war as such, but, as when we were fighting the enemy, we bound up his wounds if captured, we now shall bind up the terrible wounds inflicted by war's awful fury against these little ones, who suffer so. Let's help feed them, by all means."

L. Fisher, in duty bound, do hereby petition the Board of Supervisors of the Owyhee Drainage District, and on behalf of said drainage district heretofore organized, respectfully represent and show said honor-able court as follows, to-wit: That said Owyhee Drainage District is a drainage district duly organized and existing under and by virtue of the Drainage Laws of the State of Oregon, and by virtue of an order made and entered by the judge of the county court of Malheur county, Oregon, on the 15th day of January, 1924. That subsequent to the organization of said district such proceedings were had therein that a board of supervisors was duly and legally elected, as provided by law; that within thirty days after organizing, the said board of supervisors appointed a chief engineer for said district; that said chief engineer, so appointed, made the necessary surveys of the lands within the boundary line of said district, and made a report in writing to the board of supervisors with maps and profiles of said surveys, as provided in Section 7257, Olson's Oregon Laws, and submitted to said board of supervisors his report in writing of a "Plan for Reclamation," which said "Plan for Reclamation" was adopted by said board as provided in Section 7269, Olson's Oregon Laws; that the secretary of the board of supervisors filed such "Plan for Reclamation" with the county clerk of said county; and that the county judge of said county did appoint three commissioners, as provided in Section 7257, Olson's Oregon Laws; that said commissioners assessed the benefits and damages to any and all lands, as provided in Section 7269, Olson's Oregon Laws; that the property owners and all interested persons were notified of the filing of the commissioners' report, as provided in Section 7260, Olson's Oregon Laws; that no order or decree has been made by said court confirming said commissioners' report; that the said chief engineer has made his further surveys for a change in the "Plan for Reclamation" and made a report thereof in writing to the board of supervisors with maps and profiles of said surveys, which report contains a changed plan for draining and reclaiming the lands described in the petition praying for the organization of said district, which said changed "Plan for Reclamation," submitted in the report of said chief engineer, has been adopted by the said board of supervisors and that said changes and figures as follows, to-wit: To Board of Supervisors, Owyhee Drainage District.

REPORT ON OWYHEE DRAINAGE DISTRICT.

I herewith submit my report on the plan for reclamation and the estimate of cost of the OWYHEE DRAINAGE DISTRICT. The OWYHEE DRAINAGE DISTRICT lies along the west bank of the Owyhee river, and is what is termed river bottom lands. The soil is a sandy loam underlain with gravel. There are two distinct hard pan strata running almost north and south through the district, one along the bank of the Owyhee river and the other about midway of the district. The water logging of the lands within the district has occurred principally through the irrigation of the lands above the district that lie to the west and south of the water coming on to the lands of the district was found to be the most desirable method of drainage. The following maps are made a part of this report: 1. Map of the Owyhee Drainage District showing the location of the drains. 2. Profile of the proposed drains. 3. General and detailed specifications for the construction of the complete system.

L. I. LINE

Beginning at a point 1320' south and 130' east of the northeast corner of section 35 20 46. Thence west 4600'. L. 2 Beginning at station 2250' of L. 1 line.
