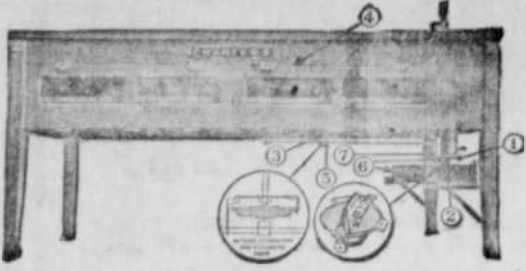

NOTICE OF ELECTION

IN THE COUNTY COURT FOR MALHEUR COUNTY, STATE OF OREGON.

In the Matter of the Organization of the SUCCOR CREEK IRRIGATION DISTRICT.

TO WHOM IT MAY CONCERN: Notice is hereby given, that on the 14th day of April, 1925, an election will be held at the residence of J. W. Graff, in Section 12, Township 23 South, Range 46 E., W. M., for the purpose of determining whether or not an irrigation district shall be organized under the provisions of Chapter XIV Title XLI Oregon Laws, and acts supplemental thereto and amendatory thereof, to provide for the irrigation of the lands within said proposed district by the storage, diversion and distribution of the unappropriated surplus and flood waters of the Owyhee River and Succor Creek, in Malheur County, Oregon; that the name of said proposed district is SUCCOR CREEK IRRIGATION DISTRICT; that at said election the qualified electors of said proposed irrigation district, the boundaries of which are hereinafter defined, shall be required to cast their ballots which shall contain the words "Irrigation District-Yes", and "Irrigation District-No" or words equivalent thereto.

That the boundaries of said proposed irrigation district are as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point where the state boundary line between the States of Idaho and Oregon intersects the midchannel of the Snake River between Lot 7 in Section 8, Township Twenty-two (22) South, Range Forty-seven (47) East, W. M., in the State of Oregon, and Lot 5 in Section 14, Township Four (4) North, Range Six (6) West, E. M., in the State of Idaho; thence south along said State line to a point where said State line intersects the East and West section line of Section 18, Township Twenty-three (23) South, Range Forty-seven (47) East, W. M., in Malheur County, Oregon; thence West to the Northwest corner of the NE 1/4 of the SW 1/4 (Lot 3) of Section 18; thence South to the southwest corner of the NE 1/4 of the SW 1/4 (Lot 3) of Section 18; thence West one-half mile to the northeast corner of the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 13, Township Twenty-three (23) South, Range Forty-six (46) East, W. M.; thence South one-fourth mile to the section line between sections 13 and 24; thence West along said section line one-half mile to the southeast corner of the SW 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of said Section 13; thence North one-half mile to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of said Section 13; thence West one-half mile to the northeast corner of the NE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 14; thence North one mile to the East and West center line of Section 11, being a point at the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of said Section 11; thence West on the center line of said Section 11 and Section 10, one mile to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 10; thence North one and one-fourth miles to the northeast corner of the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 3; thence East one-half mile to the northeast corner of the SW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 2; thence South one-fourth mile to the center of Section 2; thence North one-fourth mile to the northeast corner of the SE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of said Section 2; thence East one and one-fourth miles to the northeast corner of the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 36, Township Twenty-two (22) South, Range Forty-six (46) East, W. M.; thence West three fourths of a mile to the section line between sections 35 and 36; thence North one-fourth mile to the northeast corner of Section 35; thence West one mile to the northwest corner of Section 35; thence North one-half mile to the quarter section corner on the East line of Section 27; thence West one mile to the quarter section corner on the West line of Section 27; thence North one and one-half miles to the northeast corner of Section 21; thence West one-half mile to the quarter section corner on the North section line of Section 21; thence North one-fourth mile to the northwest corner of the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 16; thence East one-half mile to the section line between sections 15 and 16; thence North one-half mile along said section line to the northeast corner of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 16; thence South one-fourth mile to the northwest corner of the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 16; thence West one-half mile to the northwest corner of the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 16; thence North one-fourth mile to the quarter section corner on the south line of Section 9; thence West one-fourth mile; thence North one-half mile; thence West one-fourth mile to the quarter section corner on the west line of Section 9; thence North on the section line one and one-half miles, more or less, to the northwest corner of Section 4, in Township Twenty-two (22) South, Range Forty-six (46) East; thence North one mile to the northwest corner of Section Thirty-three, in Township Twenty-one (21) South, Range Forty-six (46) East; thence East three-fourths of a mile to the southeast corner of the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter (SW 1/4 SE 1/4) of Section Twenty-eight (28); thence North one-fourth mile to the northeast corner of the Southwest quarter of the Southeast quarter (SW 1/4 SE 1/4) of Section Twenty-eight (28); thence East one-fourth mile to the East line of Section Twenty-eight (28); thence North one and three-fourths miles to the northeast corner of Section Twenty-one (21), in Township Twenty-one (21) South, Range Forty-six (46) East; thence West one and three-fourths miles to the northwest corner of the Northeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section Twenty (20); thence South one-half mile to the southwest corner of the SE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 20; thence West along the east and west center line of sections 20 and 19 to the quarter section corner on the west line of Section 19, in Township Twenty-one (21) South, Range Forty-six (46) East, W. M.; thence West one and one-fourth miles to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 23, in Township Twenty-one (21) South, Range Forty-five (45) East; thence North three-fourths of a mile to the northeast corner of the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section Fourteen (14); thence West one-fourth mile to the North and South center line of Section 14; thence North one-fourth mile to the center of Section 14; thence West one-fourth mile to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of said Section 14; thence North three-fourths of a mile to the northeast corner of the SW 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 2; thence North three-fourths of a mile more or less to the North line of Section 2; Township Twenty-one (21) South, Range Forty-five (45) East, W. M.; thence East along the North section line of Section 2, one-fourth of a mile to the quarter section corner on the north line of said Section 2; thence North one-fourth mile to the northwest corner of the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 35, in Township Twenty (20) South, Range Forty-five (45) East, W. M.; thence East one-fourth mile to the quarter section corner on the north line of said Section 2; thence North one-fourth mile to the northwest corner of the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 35, being the present boundary line of the Owyhee District; thence South one-fourth mile along said boundary line to the South section line of said Section 35, that being the township line between twps. 20 and 21; thence East on said twp. line one mile, to the northeast corner of Lot 2 in Section 1, Township Twenty-one (21) South, Range Forty-five (45) East, W. M.; thence South 2 1/2 miles along the present boundary line of said Owyhee Irrigation District to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 13; thence East on the center of Sections 13 T. 21 S. R. 45 E. and 18 T. 21 S., R. 46 E. one mile, to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 18, Township Twenty-one (21) South, Range Forty-six (46) East, W. M.; thence North one mile on the boundary of said Owyhee Irrigation District to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 7; thence West to the center of Section 7; thence North three-fourths of a mile to the northeast corner of the SE 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 6; thence East one-fourth mile to the northeast corner of the SW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 6; thence North one-fourth mile to the northwest corner of the NE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 6; thence East on the center line of Sections 6 and 5, one mile, to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of said Section 5; thence South one and one-half miles, still following the boundary line of the said Owyhee Irrigation District to the South line of Section 8, being the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 17; thence East to the northeast corner of said Section 17; thence South one-fourth mile to the northeast corner of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 17; thence East one-half mile to the northeast corner of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 16; thence South one-fourth mile to the quarter section corner on the East line of Section 16; thence East one-half mile to the center of Section 15; thence South one and three-fourths miles to the northwest corner of Lot 2, in Section 27; thence West one-fourth mile to the northwest corner of the Southeast Quarter of the Northwest Quarter of Section 27; thence South, still following the boundary line of said Owyhee Irrigation District, three fourths of a mile to the southeast corner of the SW 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 27; thence West one-fourth mile to the southwest corner of Section 27; thence South one-half mile to the quarter section corner on the West line of Section 34; thence West one-fourth mile to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 33, in Township Twenty-one (21) South, Range Forty-six (46) East, W. M.; thence South, still following said boundary line one and three-fourths miles to the northeast corner of the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 9, Township Twenty-two (22) South, Range Forty-six (46) East, W. M.; thence East one-fourth mile to the northeast corner of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 9; thence South along the East section line of Section 9 to the southeast corner thereof; thence East on the South line of Section 10, to the quarter section corner on the South line of

Section 10; thence South one-fourth mile to the northeast corner of the SE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 15; thence East one-fourth mile to the northeast corner of the SW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 15; thence South three-fourths of a mile to the section line between sections 15 and 23; thence East one-half mile along said section line, extended, to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 23; thence South one-half mile to the southwest corner of the SE 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 23; thence West along the East and West center line of Section 23, to the quarter section corner on the West line of said section; thence South along the West line of Section 23, three fourths of a mile to the northeast corner of the SE 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of Section 27; thence East one-half mile to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the NW 1/4 of Section 26; thence North one-fourth mile to the quarter section corner on the North line of Section 26; thence East one-half mile to the northeast corner of Section 26; thence North one-fourth mile to the northeast corner of the SE 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 23; thence East one-fourth mile to the southeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SW 1/4 of Section 24; thence North three-fourths of a mile to the section line between Sections 24 and 13; thence East along said section line one-half mile to the northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the NE 1/4 of said Section 24; thence North one-half mile to the Northeast corner of the NW 1/4 of the SE 1/4 of Section 13; thence East one-fourth mile to the quarter section corner on the East line of Section 13; thence North along the section line on the East side of Sections 13, 12 and 1, extended, to where said line intersects the midchannel of the Snake River; thence following the said midchannel of the Snake River up to the point of beginning.

That at said election to determine whether or not said proposed irrigation district shall be organized, there shall be elected three directors, who shall be residents of the State of Oregon and bona fide owners of land within the boundaries of said proposed district, to serve as a Board of Directors for said district, and said directors shall be elected at large therein.

That at said election the polls shall be open at 8 o'clock A. M. and shall remain open until 8 o'clock P. M. and that said election shall be conducted as nearly as practicable in accordance with the general election laws of the state of Oregon.

This notice is given subject and pursuant to an Order of the County Court for Malheur County, State of Oregon, entered at its regular session on the 4th day of March, 1925, wherein said Court, among other things, determined that the petition of Oscar F. Selle and others, praying for the organization of said proposed district contained the requisite number of signers under the laws of Oregon, and that said petition and notice thereof were duly published as by law required, and that said lands are susceptible of irrigation from the same source and by the same system of works, by the storage, diversion and distribution of the waters of the Owyhee River and Succor Creek, in Malheur County, Oregon.

NOTICE OF BOND SALE In the Matter of the Owyhee Drainage District. NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that sealed proposals will be received by the Owyhee Drainage District in their office in Nyssa, Malheur County, Oregon, until the hour of 2 o'clock p. m. on Saturday, the 25th day of April, 1925, and immediately thereafter publicly opened by the Board of Supervisors of the Owyhee Drainage District, for the purchase of bonds of said District in the sum of Fourteen Thousand Dollars (\$14,000.00), said bonds to be in denominations of not less than One Hundred (\$100) or more than Five Hundred (\$500) Dollars, said bonds to bear date of May 1st, 1925, and to mature serially in annual amounts so as to be approximately equal, principal and interest, and to mature commencing May 1st, 1930, and ending May 1st, 1945, said bonds to bear interest at six per cent (6 per cent) per annum, payable semi-annually on the first days of May and November, principal and interest payable at the Malheur County Bank, Nyssa, Oregon, or at the fiscal agency of the state of Oregon in New York City, at the option of the holder.

Said proposals must be accompanied by a certified check for five per cent (5 per cent) of the amount thereof, the same to be forfeited to the District as liquidated damages in the event the successful bidder fails to pay for said bonds within ten (10) days after the award. The bidder shall be required to procure the approving legal opinion, and said proposals are made subject to the legality of said issue and confirmation of the proceedings of said District.
