HISTORY REPEATING.

The efforts of the religionists of Tennessee to prevent the teaching of evolution is not the first time that religion has attempted to prevent scientific truth from becoming known. It has happened in many cases, the reason being that very often scientific truth conflicts with the teaching of the Bible, and in order to prevent the Bible from being discredited it is necessary to deny the truth of scientific discoveries. Thus we see that the evolutionary trial in Tennessee is merely a case of history repeating itself. Martin Luther, John Calvin and John Wesley, all deeply religious men and founders of religious organizations, all fought the scientific discoveries of their day. Luther characterized Copernicus as "an astronomer who strove to show that the world revolves, not the heavens or the firmament, the sun and the moon. This fool wishes to reverse the entire science of astronomy."

Calvin pinned his faith upon the Psalm which says: "The world also is established so that it cannot be moved" and wanted to know "who will venture to place the authority of Copernicus above that of the holy spirit." A hundred years from now the statements of those who are now fighting evolution will appear as foolish to the people of that day as the above statements of Luther and Calvin do to the people of the present day. The mantle of these men has evidently fallen upon Bryan and he is battling valiantly to carry on their work of preventing scientific truths from becoming known.

Once upon a time, so the story goes, a king went down to the sea shore and ordered the waves to quit rolling onto the beach. He had been kidded into the belief that he was all-powerful and that even the waves would obey him. He was no more foolish than those who would seek to prevent the spread of truth.

What should be done to a school teacher who would teach that the earth revolves around

the sun, or that the rainbow is caused by reflection of light rays on water or that man was not created in the image of God? Those school teachers in the District of Columbia are liable to lose their salaries for it, but that seems a totally inadequate punishment for promulgating such heretical doctrine. Too bad the good old days are gone when men were put on the rack and pulled to pieces for teaching doctrine contrary to the Bible.

Bryan et al succeeded in convicting Scopes of violating a state law of Tennessee. We are also told that the mountain labored and brought forth a mouse.

"Evolution a Witness of God."

The above is the title given a booklet issued by the Rev. George Craig Stewart, D. D., L. H. D., a rector of St. Luke's Episcopal church of Evanston, Ill. Dr. Stewart is prominent nationally in the councils of his church. "I hold no static conception of the Bible as I hold no static conception of life," says Dr. Stewart. "The Bible is itself a conspicuous example of the law of evolution. It was not created in a day, as the world was not created in a day. It has upon it the marks of the lower forms of man's primitive ideals, just as man bears upon him the physical marks of the lower forms from which this organism was evolved. Man is no less divine because he still carries with him a pineal gland and a vermiform appendix, relics of lower and now abandoned use. The amazing thing about the Bible is its great, steady, pulsing note of development. "The universe is immensely larger, and God is immensely larger and greater than any Hebrew prophet ever dreamed, and we have to thank modern science for stretching out the heavens, enlarging the horizons of creation, and crowning God as creator with many more and manifold crowns. "Evolution is not a thing. It is not a God. It is not a substitute for God. It never did anything. It never created anything. It has not added a featherweight of probability or reasonableness to materialism or atheism. There is nothing irreligious about evolution. It does not answer the 'who' or the 'what' of creation; it does, however, throw light upon the 'how' of creation.

"Truth, from whatever horizon it comes, must be welcomed, for truth in any and every form is of God, is a revelation of God, is a word of God. "It is incredible that today there should be men claiming to be intelligent who can still indulge in the cheap jibes about monkeys in which the controversialists of 50 years ago indulged. "Paleontologists have discovered in river beds, in gravel and in silt the fossil remains of the Rhodesian man, the Neanderthal man, the Heidelberg man, the Piltdown man, the Java man (perhaps more ape than man), who lived some half million years ago. "I am not ashamed to have a monkey for my ancestor but I would be ashamed to claim kinship with a man who used his great gifts to obscure the truth. "Now I do not say, nor does any other anthropologist say, that man sprang from any of the species of monkeys that are on the earth today. No one claims he did."

The Hight of the Ridiculous

Washington, July 22.—A test suit to restrain authorities from teaching evolution and other sciences in the public schools of the District of Columbia was filed in the district supreme court here today by Lauren H. Wittmer, government clerk.

Involving all the unheard evidence of the Scopes trial, the suit seeks to prevent payment of teachers' salaries under a clause of the district appropriation bill passed by congress which states that no part of the funds should be used for teaching disrespect for the Holy Bible.

The public school authorities of the district were ordered by the court to appear July 28 and answer the test suit.

In 12 stipulations the petition presents supposed variations between science and the Bible.

Philology, it is contended, denied the Biblical story of the origin of man; teaches disintegration of organic bodies after death, whereas the Bible says all will arise on judgment day, and refutes the Bible statement that man is the perfect physical image of God.

Chemistry, the suit argues, teaches that one elemental matter cannot be changed into another simple elemental matter, whereas, the Bible says that Christ made wine out of water; that God man out of the dust of the earth and that God turned Lot's wife into a pillar of salt.

Physics teaches that the rainbow is the natural reflection of light rays on water in the clouds, whereas the Bible states God made the rainbow as a promise to Noah that God would not again kill every living thing on the earth by a flood.

Astronomy sets fourth that the sun is the center of the solar system and the earth revolves around the sun, "whereas the Holy Bible plainly shows that the earth is the center of the universe."

Philology tells that language and speech are the gradual outgrowth of thought brought about by evolution of man, whereas the Bible teaches the earth had one language until God confounded man's speech when man attempted to build the tower of Babel. Wittmer brought the suit as a taxpayer of the district.

"I am on the side of science," he told the United Press, "but filed this suit as a test to determine what congress really meant when it wrote its restrictive clause on the Bible into the appropriation bill.

Potato Crop Moving

The Nyssa potato crop began rolling to market this week and in another week or ten days the harvest will be on in full blast. The acreage in potatoes this year is only about half what it was last year, according to Inspector Chas. Thompson, but the yield and quality are good and the price satisfactory. So far the price is \$2 per cwt. and about 50 cars have been contracted at that figure. Gilchrist and Lamb are shipping this week. Inspector Thompson expects to start in some time next week and devote his whole time to grading the shipments. His district comprises Nyssa, Overstreet and Adrian.

Severe Hail Storm

Reports reach us of the most severe hail storm ever known in the Snake valley which occurred Wednesday afternoon of this week. The territory affected is south and east of Homedale, Ida., where several square miles were devastated. Extremely large hailstones, accompanied by severe winds, wrecked the growing crops and fruit orchards. Wheat is reported as being beaten into the ground, corn trimmed of leaves till nothing but the bare stalk with perhaps a portion of the tassel, remains. Of livestock, chickens, turkeys, pigs and lambs, where unsheltered, were killed. Buildings were damaged also, shingles splintered, windows broken, etc. Hail was reported in the neighborhood of the Kestner ranch as covering the ground to a depth of six inches, and some stones were as large as eggs.

Water Shortage Ended

The shortage of city water, which has caused considerable inconvenience to householders for the past few weeks, is a thing of the past, according to Marshal Cook. All the pumps have been discarded and an air compressor installed. The new power throws 200 gallons per minute, which is ample for the present. It is the intention to sink one of the wells 50 feet deeper, which it is believed will greatly increase the available water supply.
