ERADICATE SCRUBS TO IMPROVE HERDS

(Prepared by the United States Department of Agriculture.) "Scrub-bull eradication campaigns" are rapidly gaining the favor of enterprising county agents as a means of improving the cattle of their counties.

For the organization meeting the Hopkins county farm bureau arranged a banquet for the community committeemen and business men. One hundred and fourteen attended. An executive committee of five men was selected.

A campaign was also held in Chester county, S. C., where 18 bulls were placed during the week. The county agent reports that he has several more prospects for pure-bred bulls, also that a number of communities have pledged themselves to eliminate the scrub bull.

Some Mineral Mixtures Are Good for Porks

Some of these simple mixtures are good for swine: Equal parts by weight of ground limestone and salt; equal parts of wood ashes and salt. These supply calcium, but no appreciable amounts of phosphorus.

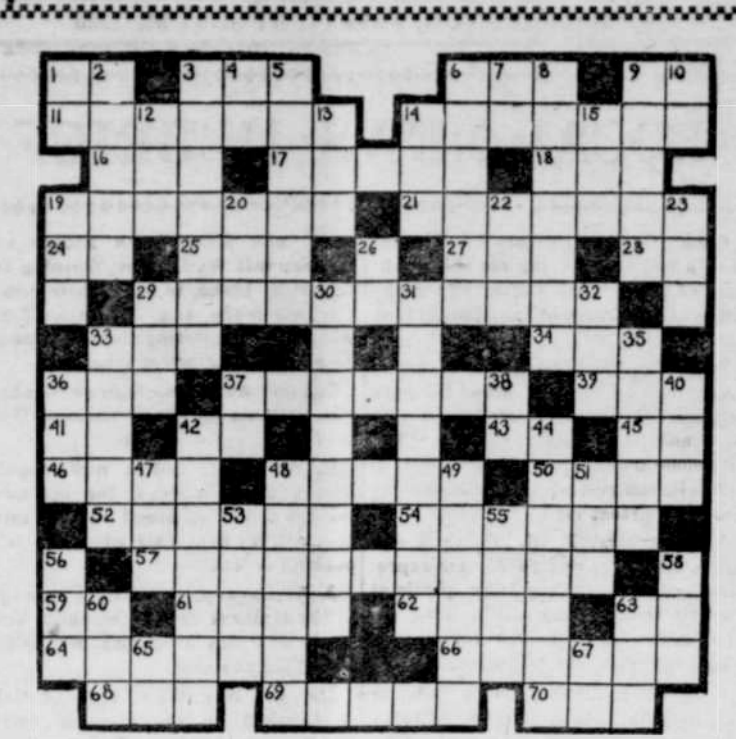
Skim Milk Will Improve Ration for Market Hogs

Skim milk added to a ration of corn and tankage enabled the Ohio experiment station to market hogs weighing 255 pounds almost three weeks earlier than those fed on corn and tankage alone, at a saving of 78 cents a hundred weight on feed costs.

Eradicate Stomach Worms

As a drench for the eradication of stomach worms in sheep, gasoline is the one most commonly used by flock owners in the United States. It should be given on three successive mornings after the animals have been kept away from all food and drink for sixteen hours, and after the dose is given they should be fasted for two or three hours more.

Budding Apple Tree Is Usually Done in Summer

Buds from the ends of the branches are to be preferred to those taken from sprouts in budding apple trees. It is possible that the sprouts may be coming from the roots of the tree which may not be the same as the top if the tree was grafted in the beginning, and they would give the wrong variety. Apple trees may be budded in the spring but it is best to wait until later, depending upon the time that the tree stops growing.

Horticultural NEWS

BUDDING OF FRUIT TREES IN AUGUST

Budding of apple, peach and other fruit trees should be done between now and the first of September, according to the recommendation of the horticultural department of the New Jersey Agricultural Experiment station.

The buds of the desired variety are found on well-grown shoots of the current season's growth. Cut these from the tree and trim by cutting off the leaves just above the buds. These are known as "bud sticks" and should be kept moist and not allowed to dry out.

The bud should be cut from the bud stick together with about an inch of bark. Care should be taken to select only strong, well-developed leaf buds. The bud is then pushed down through the vertical cut until the edge of bark above the bud is just below the cross cut on the stock.

Black Raspberries and Blackcaps Are the Same

Blackcaps and black raspberries are one and the same, in spite of the fact that some folks are occasionally heard to proclaim their preference for blackcaps over black raspberries. They are probably confusing black raspberries with blackberries. There are hosts of local names and synonyms for most plants, and the confusion that attends them is frequently tremendous.

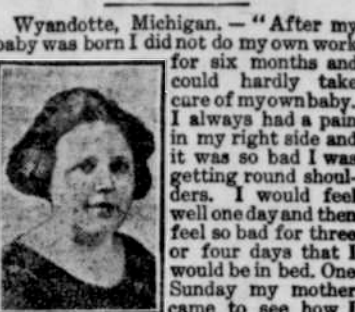

Horticulture Facts

- Wood ashes are a good fertilizer to apply in small quantities to fruit plants. Under no circumstances must young dewberry plants be allowed to battle with weeds. Sheets spread beneath plum trees to catch the curculios make the insects easy to gather up and destroy. Lead arsenate alone, or in combination with lime, should never be applied to peach trees during the growing season. Keep bug poison mixed and handy. Bugs are early in early springs, and worse yet, they stay late. The longer the season the more they can breed. Get at them early. The plum requires a little more water than other tree fruits, and cultivation and cover crop are necessary to give sufficient moisture. Grape rows should be about ten feet apart for most varieties. The vines should be set from eight to ten feet apart in the row. Strong growing vines should be set ten feet apart. Despite the fact that plums want a rich soil, probably most of the fertilizers used for this fruit are wasted.
