CRITICISES THE PUBLIC SCHOOLS

The Malheur Enterprise makes the following severe criticism of our public school system, and it must be admitted that there is a certain amount of truth in the arraignment:

"Thoughtful educators have been studying the problem of how better to adapt our school system to the practical needs of the new generation of citizens. It is evident to any unprejudiced observer that much of the effort expended in present day education is illogical and futile. Much that is taught in the public schools is of value only as a means toward securing a teacher's certificate—to teach others to secure a teacher's certificate, and so on.

"The average high school graduate is about as helpless an individual, so far as earning a living is concerned, as could well be imagined. Few of them are able to spell, punctuate, capitalize or construct a grammatical sentence in English, and though they may have a smattering of Latin, French or Spanish, they are unable to pronounce correctly many of the most common English words. Their vocabularies are so limited as to be pitiful.

"Thus after twelve years of school work they have a very limited knowledge of their mother tongue, which they must use every day and hour of their lives.

In every other subject of practical use they are equally deficient, having only a superficial acquaintance with numerous textbooks, studied for the sold purpose of earning credits.

Considering the fact that only a small percentage can hope to go to college or enter the professions, it seems unfair to the rank and file to force them to waste so much time on what Kipling calls "futile piffle." Much of the stuff crammed into our school children is just that, being without either cultural or practical value.

No one has yet come forward with an explanation of how a flood such as is mentioned in the Bible could have occurred by natural means. This is regrettable. There are any number of readers of the Journal who believe that the flood as described in Genesis actually occurred. They not only believe it themselves, but they insist that everybody else believe it. Then why not have the courage of their conviction and explain how it could be. It is a little unreasonable to expect people to believe in an event that would necessitate covering the entire earth with a body of water five and a half miles deep (which would equal in volume several times what is now in all the oceans) without explaining where this immense amount of water came from.

Deegan Story Denied

Thomas F. Deegan, a Philadelphia lobbyist, stirred up a hornet's nest when he gave out a statement last week of an alleged agreement with James M. Kyle, president of the Oregon Irrigation congress, in which Mr. Deegan and colleagues were to receive some \$500,000 in satisfaction of some old claims on a defunct irrigation project. Mr Kyle emphatically denies having made any such agreement. The Malheur Enterprise, in commenting on the matter, says:

Deegan, who is known to old time residents of the Malheur valley, claimed for himself all kinds of credit in getting the project appropriation approved by congress and named many members whom he influenced.

As a result Dr. Mead declared that an investigation would be made of the matter.

"The falsity of the Deegan yarn is apparent to everyone familiar with the operations of Dennis Brogan in this section," says the editor of the Enterprise. "Everyone here knows that the claims which Deegan says he has on the old Bully creek project are worthless, for if he is the owner of the dam which broke a year ago he is liable for damages in greater amount than its original cost. Further, many of the lands on which he claims to have a mortgage are owned by the county on tax liens.

Not only has Mr Kyle emphatically branded the story as false, but Ralph Holte of Vale and Estes Merton of Harper, the latter an one of the directors of the new district, deny in toto."
