## Packing Plant to Be Enlarged

Just why growers of fruits and vegetables should complain of a lack of market is not apparent when the prices quoted by the Idaho Packing corporation are taken into consideration. A dispatch from Nampa says:

Enlargement of the plant of the Idaho Packing corporation, which has operated a plant here this season, will be considered as soon as the packing season is over. Elton Stinson, manager, told a gathering of farmers here Saturday afternoon. It is intended to construct new buildings and install additional modern equipment.

The great need now, it was said, is for storage of vegetables, berries and the like to keep the plant operating at capacity. The product of a plant four or five times the capacity of the present factory can be disposed of in this territory, it was said.

Berries from at least 200 acres can be used, Manager Stinson asserted, and the company is ready now to contract for strawberries on the basis of 9 cents a pound, or about 90 cents a crate, and for red and black raspberries at 12 cents a pound, or \$1.25 a crate.

Next season the company will pay \$16 a ton for tomatoes and for Refuge or Buepee beans \$60 a ton. Golden Bantam corn will be bought at \$15 a ton and Evergreen and white varieties for \$12.

This season the entire product of the cannery has been purchased for consumption within a radius of 150 miles of this city it was said, and the demand is so great that the company cannot fill orders from other sections of the state.

One of the installations planned is machinery for making catsup and the same machinery will be used for canning pumpkins.

## Buy Cemetery Site

A movement is on foot by Nyssa citizens to purchase land for a cemetery, including that already in use for the West Side cemetery. The land desired is a part of the P. J. Phillips homestead and at the present time can be purchased from Malheur county at a nominal figure, probably about the amount of taxes due on it. It is proposed to buy 40 acres, probably the smallest unit the county would sell, and then form an organization to administer it. The present situation is very unsatisfactory, as title cannot be given to plots and there is no one to look after upkeep and improvements. We understand Attorney E. M. Blodgett has agreed to attend to the necessary legal work free of charge, and the matter should be pushed to early completion. A few years ago an attempt was made to secure title to the cemetery site, but for some reason it was abandoned without getting very far. Let us hope the present effort will be more successful.
