## New Alfalfa Weevil

### Quarantine Announced

Word has been received from Mr. Chas. A. Cole, secretary of the Oregon State Board of Agriculture, as follows: "Colorado and Missouri have placed a quarantine against Malheur and Baker counties, subject, Alfalfa Weevil."

The text of these orders have not been received by the local inspection authorities, but it is presumed that it will affect shipments to these states in much the same manner as those to states which have heretofore placed quarantine embargoes against Malheur county products making it necessary to secure a certificate on certain products and entirely preventing shipment into these states of other products.

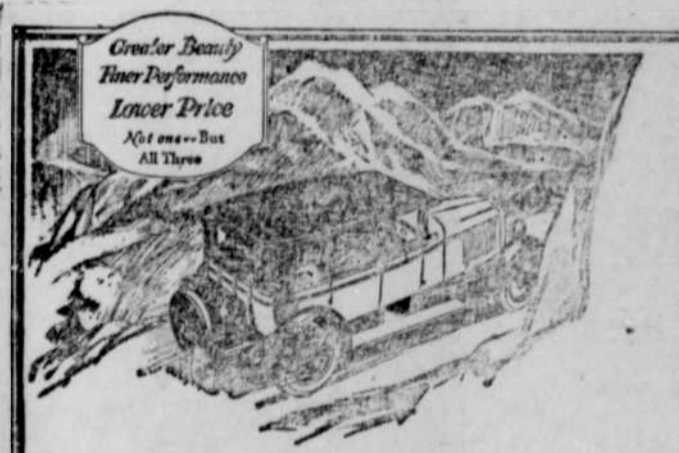
