Are Boosting for Railroad Extension

S. A. Mullinix, W. J. Hinton, Chas. Blodgett and J. E. Ingham, representing the commercial interests of Grand View, Idaho and the varied interests of the Snake and Bruneau valleys of Canyon county, Idaho, met with representatives of business interests of Nyssa on Thursday of this week.

The construction of the rail link between Clatonia, a few miles south of Homedale, and Buhl, present terminus of the Twin Falls branch, was the matter under consideration.

A combination is to be effected among the commercial organizations from Twin Falls to Weiser. This combined influence to be directed toward the O. S. L. directorate in an effort to have constructed 145 miles of road necessary to open to settlement the 600,000 acres of what has been known as "the great Bruneau project. Believing the time ripe for agitation of this construction, a delegation from each community and commercial organization in the Snake valley is requested to meet O. S. L. representatives at Twin Falls on the 15th of February, this being the date of the opening of the Rogerson Wells R. R. cutoff.

From Colorado

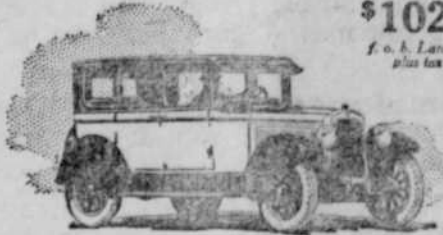
