NOTICE OF SHERIFF'S SALE

By virtue of an execution in foreclosure duly issued by the Clerk of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, for the County of Malheur, dated the 21st day of June 1927, and directed to me upon a decree and order of sale rendered in said court on the 15th day of June, 1927, in a certain suit in the Circuit Court for said state and county, wherein George L. Phillips was plaintiff and Randall Sage, G. H. Ross, J. W. Robinson, George Robinson, H. Y. Blackwell, Consolidated Wagon and Machine Company, a corporation, C. C. Cotton, Bank of Nyssa, a banking corporation, Frank C.
