EXAMINATION NOTICE

The following taken from a letter from Superintendent of Public Instruction, C. A. Howard imparts information relative to accrediting of private music teachers and must meet the specified requirements:

"The passing of a brief written examination on the state course of study in music and the methods and technique of instruction. The examination will be given at ten o'clock on August 19th under the supervision of the city superintendent or the high school principal.

The questions will be prepared under the direction of the State Department of Education, and the papers will be returned to this department to be examined.

If you wish to be certified and can meet the above requirements, please fill out the inclosed blank and return it to us by July 15th. If these requirements are satisfactorily met, arrangements will be made for you to take examination. If all the requirements are met, including the satisfactory passing of an examination, a certificate of such duration as the examining

board may determine will be issued to you, the fee for which will be two dollars."

NOTICE OF SHERIFF'S SALE
