The successful bidders for the Power and Telephone Line from Nyssa to the Owyhee Dam site were the Helt & O'Donald Company of Portland, Oregon and said company have sub-let the contract for digging the holes, clearing and delivering of poles and material to Messrs. Wimp and Howell, work to begin Monday morning, June the 11th.

Both Messrs. Wimp and Howell have recently bought property adjoining Nyssa and have decided to make this their permanent home. Both men are energetic contractors. Mr. Wimp has been actively engaged as an Electrical contractor for the past four years in Burns, Oregon. HIGBY GETS CONTRACT

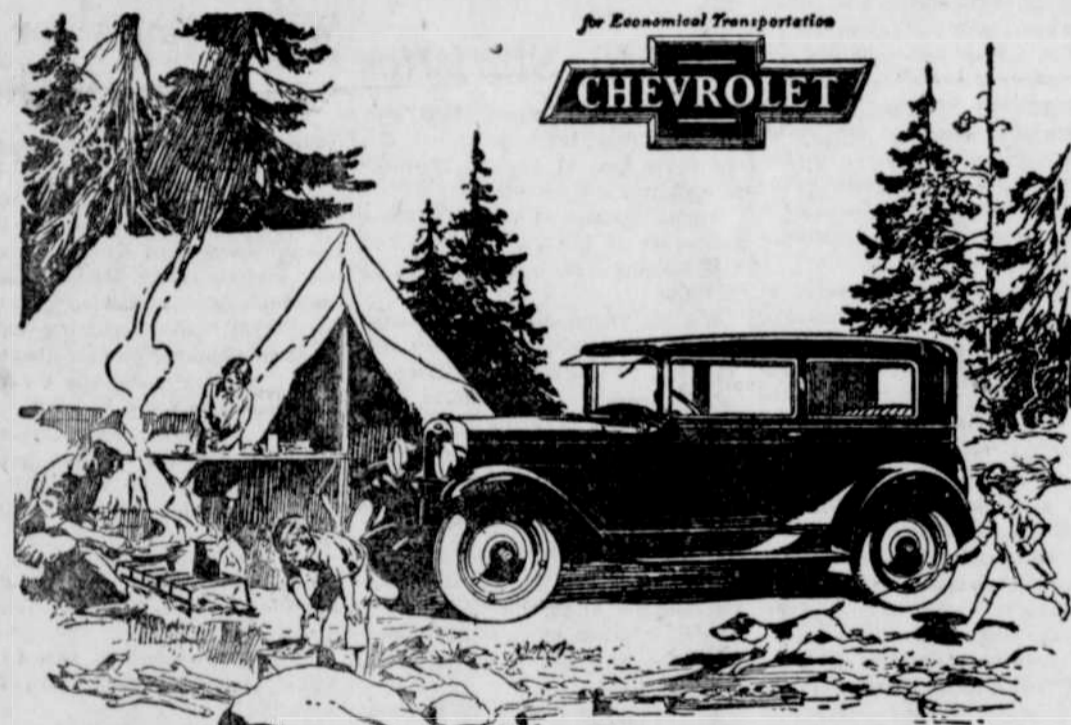
L. E. Higby has been awarded the contract for distributing the railroad ties along the railroad right-of-way to the dam site. He returned this week from Portland, where he went to purchase another truck, making three in all which will be used on the contract. Mr. Higby's job will be to distribute the ties along at convenient intervals for the steel layers. It will require about 3000 ties a day to keep ahead of the track layers. Approximately a mile a day will be completed. About 70,000 ties will be needed in the construction. It is thought track-laying will begin Monday.
