W. C. T. U. NOTES

The county W. C. T. U. held a convention Tuesday, September 18, at the home of Mrs. Walters in Ontario, at which the following Nyssa people were present: Mrs. Mabel Higby, Mrs. Betty Forbes, Mrs. Lois Callas, Mrs. Virgie Spencer, Mrs. Katherine Reberger and Mrs. Josie Douglas. The meeting was called to order by the president, Mrs. C. E. Bingham with singing from "Everybody Sing." scripture reading by Mrs. Lines and prayers by different members. The program, which was in charge of Mrs. Troxell, was then put on. Rev. Lines spoke on the proposed amendments to the constitution of Oregon, speaking in favor of an increase in the gasoline tax, ballot 300 and 301, and a reduction of license, 302 and 303, saying that tourists going through wore out our roads and didn't have to pay license to us and we must keep up the roads by taxing the automobiles of our own people. Oregon has the highest automobile tax of any state in the union. California has a \$3.00 license and puts a good tax on gasoline, so that cars that run there must pay the most. Rev. Lines also spoke in favor of 304 and 305, the income tax, and 306 and 307, a bill limiting the power of the legislature, saying that no corporation has a right to cut our timber or gain on our resources unless they pay for it.

Mrs. Troxell then spoke on several different subjects. Among them was the government control of liquor in Canada, which has proved a failure. A number of interesting things were spoken of, one being that the president controls 40,000 appointments.

Mrs. Bingham spoke briefly on the coming election and appointed Mrs. Ueick, Mrs. Spencer and Mrs. Callas as a committee on campaign work to get leaflets to send the voters.

The county officers were then balloted for and Mrs. C. E. Bingham was unanimously elected president. The other officers were elected the same as last year except the corresponding secretary, who would not act, and Mrs. Young was elected in her place. A list of the officers will be given next week. The meeting adjourned and refreshments were served.

The Nyssa W. C. T. U., under the direction of Mrs. Lois Callas, held a tea in the basement of the M. E. church Friday, September 14. Tea was served both afternoon and evening. At 8 p. m. program was given as follows: Music by the high school orchestra, consisting of Mrs. H. J. Ward, violin, also conducting; George Reberger, violin; Ruth Reberger, piano; Virginia Bartlett, saxophone; Hershel Thompson, cornet; Betty Tensen, clarinet. Speech by Mrs. John Forbes. Another selection by the orchestra, a short speech by Mrs. Mabel Higby and reading by Mrs. Lois Callas and Mrs. Josie E. Douglas. The program as well as the tea, was enjoyed by all.
