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WHAT INTELLIGENT, COOPERATIVE EFFORT
WILL ACCOMPLISH

Below is a letter which tells its own story of the fine results being achieved by the close cooperation of local communities and the state chamber in securing new settlers for Oregon lands. J. D. Fairman, merchant, Harper, is chairman of the local committee of Malheur county business men and farmers, interested in securing families for the first unit of the big federal reclamation undertaking, the Vale Project, 3700 acres of which will receive its first water next spring. The State Chamber manager visited this project, outlined an advertising campaign to which the local land settlement association contributed, and the program has been carried forth with the results noted below. To date, practically all of the 3700 acres in the first unit have been sold, which practically insures another appropriation next year of

\$2,000,000 to bring water to additional acreage.

In his recent letter to the state chamber, Mr. Fairman stated, "I cannot refrain from taking an opportunity to convey to you the appreciation of our Association for the work you have done on our behalf. It has been splendid and the Los Angeles office has sent us, and is sending us, every day the best inquiries we get. I cannot say off hand how many inquiries we have received through your two offices, but it is several hundred, and have located a number of very desirable people through your efforts. I think your Los Angeles office venture the most valuable move ever made by Oregon."

W. H. Doolittle, secretary of the Ontario chamber of commerce, is actively associated in the work of securing settlers for the Vale and Owyhee projects. Mr. Doolittle has carried on a very successful campaign for new settlers in the Ontario district for several years and has been of service to the association in securing settlers for the Vale Project.

Irving Province, secretary of the Vale chamber, is also doing his bit, as are realtors and others of Malheur county.
