Farm Pointers

Considerable damage has been
done to fruit trees recently
through failure of farmers to
clean thoroughly their spray
tanks in which preparations for
killing weeds have been used be-
fore using them again for orchard
spraying, says the Oregon Experi-
ment station.

The principle factors that seem
to effect the cost of filling silos
are the size of the crew and the
length of the haul, says the Ore-
gon Experiment station in the re-
port of a three year cost study
now published in bulletin form,
entitled, "Cost of Producing Sil-
age and Kale in the Willamette
Valley."

An experiment station is entire-
ly different from a demonstration
farm. The former tries out both
good and poor crops and practices
to save the general farming pub-
lic the hazards and expense of
this work. A demonstration
farm shows what can be done
with the best crops and methods
developed.

Some Oregon dairymen are
finding that a thick whitewash
applied twice a year with a brush
is more practical than a thin coat-
ing mixed with a milk binder and
sprayed on. The thick water-
lime whitewash scales off easily
after it gets soiled, making re-
newal easy.

One farmer thought he had
made a real discovery when he
found he could save feed by giv-
ing the cows their hay ration at
night when they came off his
limited pasture. The best plan
in Oregon is to give a cow all the
roughage, pasture and succulents
she will eat and then if she won't
return a profit, get rid of her,
says the experiment station.

Home Pointers

Pectin is the substance which
gives fruit its jellifying property.
It is found in fruits naturally, or
is formed when the fruit is boiled
with water, as in making an ex-
traction of fruit juice for jelly.

The inclusion of not more than
25 per cent of unripe cherries in
making cherry preserves has
been found to improve the con-
sistency somewhat. The use of
more than this amount may tend
to spoil the flavor.

Beets can be cooked in a fire-
less cooker, a pressure cooker or
a steamer, or may be boiled, cov-
ered or uncovered and as long as
the skins are not broken they
will come out a good red color.

Acid substances, such as vine-
gar are favorable to red colored
vegetables, while alkali, which is
found in some hard water, will
spoil the red color if the vege-
table is cut or peeled so as to ex-
pose it to the water. Just the
opposite is true for green vege-
tables.

Green vegetables are much
more attractive if they come to
the table with some shape, in-
stead of limp and mushy, and
with as much as possible of their
natural fresh green color.

Picnic time is here, and people
are again consuming the inevit-
able "boiled" egg, either plain,
deviled, in salads, or some such
manner. These will be much
more tender and easily digested,
and will lack that leathery tex-
ture, if they are not "boiled" at
all, but are cooked in hot water
below the boiling point.
