WORKER CRUSHED BY TUMBLING TIMBER AT DAM

Victim Was World War Veteran; Leaves No Relatives

J. E. Provencher, 41 years of age, working 130 feet under the Owyhee river at the new dam near Nyssa, was crushed to death Tuesday, July 29 by a timber falling down a shaft.

Provencher was working at the bottom of the shaft and had little room to move around. He saw the timber in the course of its fall and despite his cramped quarters made a desperate attempt to get out of the way. In this he was partially successful, the timber falling beside him. It snapped in two when it hit the bottom and a piece of it struck him in the back, fatally injuring him. Companions brought him to the surface and called medical aid. He died two hours later.

He was born at St. Monique, Can., but served in the United States army during the World war. He was a member of the San Francisco lodge of Eagles and papers in his effects gave Portland as his home address. Before dying he said he had no relatives. He had worked at the dam several months.

RECLAMATION CONGRESS MEETS AT BURNS AUG. 7

Many of the present and future reclamation policies of Oregon will be considered at the annual meeting of the Oregon Reclamation congress at Burns August 7-9 which will be attended by an unusually large number of public officials as well as the regular members.

The second day of the meeting will be devoted largely to the annual field day demonstrations at the Harney branch experiment station. Of particular interest this year is the operation of a large irrigation well which is making good crops while drouth is affecting those not watered.

Phil Metschan Is Choice For Gov.

Nominee Is Picked On 14th Vote By State Central Committee.

Phil Metschan, for eight years past, chairman of the Republican state central committee, head of the Imperial hotel in Portland, and for several years a member of the Port of Portland commission, was made the Republican gubernatorial nominee by the state central committee Saturday during mid-afternoon when on the 14th ballot he polled 20 votes, one more than a majority of the committee. The result announced, his nomination was made unanimous.

Metschan's nomination came at the close of a hard fought contest between himself and Ralph Hamilton of Bend, Thomas B. Kuy of Salem and Senator Jay Upton of Bend, while during the last five ballots Julius L. Meier forged ahead from a low of two to a high of 10 votes.

MRS. JOE MINTON PASSES AWAY SUDDENLY

Nyssa people were shocked by the sudden death of Mrs. Joe Minton, who passed away at 5:30 P. M. on Tuesday, July 29, after a few days illness at the home of her daughter, Mrs. Tom Newby where she had been staying for several days assisting in the care of her little grandson, Billy Newby. Heart trouble followed by pneumonia was the cause of her death.

Mary Bontrager Minton was born in La Grange county, Indiana on September 29, 1863.

On January 7, 1899, at Arcadia Oregon, she was united in marriage to Joe Minton, to this union three children were born: Cletus Minton, Christie Minton and Mrs. Tom Newby. With her husband she came to Nyssa in 1899, residing here for three years, then moving to Boise Valley where they lived for eight years, when they again returned to Nyssa.

About thirty years ago she united with the Southern Methodist church. Mrs. Newby was loved by all who knew her; always doing for others, forgetful of self, and her departure was mourned deeply by her family and neighbors.

She leaves her husband and three children, Cletus, of Boise, Christie Minton and Mrs. Tom Newby, of Nyssa, four grandchildren, two brothers, A. W. Bontrager, of Bend, Ore., and D. J. Bontrager, of Portland.
