### WEED CONTROL DISTRICT NOTICE

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN That the County Court of Malheur County, Oregon, at its meeting held on the 16th day of July, 1930, by resolution duly adopted, declared the entire County of Malheur to be and constitute a weed control district under the terms of Chapter 265 of the General Laws of Oregon for 1923 and amendments thereof for the purpose of destroying and preventing the seeding and spread of noxious weeds and plants, and that the following weeds and plants are determined and declared by said resolution to be noxious weeds within the meaning of said act, to-wit:

Morning Glory, Russian Knap Weed, California Puncture Vine, Canadian Thistle, White Top, Bull Thistle and Milk Weed.

Said court by said resolution, appointed R. G. Larson, County Agent of Malheur County, as weed inspector, and after publication of this notice for two weeks as provided by law, the said resolution will become effective and said weed inspector will have the authority conferred upon him by law for the enforcement of the provisions thereof.
