ALONG LIFE'S TRAIL

ONE FALSE STEP

Stokes had had a hard road to hoe all through his life. His parents had died when he was a small boy and he had been left to struggle alone. He had been ambitious to get somewhere above mediocrity in the world, and had worked hard to accomplish his purpose. He got through high school through his own efforts, though he had to starve out a year or two to earn money to continue.

The people with whom he worked were pleased with him. He entered a small college two or three years later than the average man and made his way as he had been doing in high school. He was a junior when he first came to see me to tell me his story. He had made a false step. He had been dismissed from the college which he had been attending.

All through the three years during which he had been a student, his character had been above reproach, and his work well done. Then he had been caught attempting to open the locked desk of one of his instructors with a master key—a desk in which the examination questions for the next day's test were lying. The key had come into his possession legitimately without his knowing that it was a master key, chance had revealed that fact to him, and curiosity only, he averred, had led him to experiment with it. He had not, at first at least, intended to be dishonest. Innocence is impossible to prove in such a case, and there seemed nothing for the authorities to do but to dismiss him. His chances, with such a blot on his character, of getting into another institution were very slight.

"Doesn't it seem unjust," he said to me, "that one false step should prove or ruin a man for life? I've gone straight for more than twenty years, and now this one error has wiped out all my chances for life."

"It is the way of the world," I had to admit. "It doesn't seem fair, but we are all judged not by the virtuous things which we have done, but by the errors we have made, and the error of a moment may wipe out the virtue of years. It is a thing worth thinking about."
