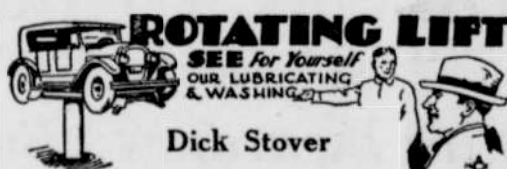

devisees, of any, of said defendants.

You, and each of you, are hereby
required to appear and answer the
complaint filed against you in the above
entitled suit on or before the expiration
of four weeks after the service of
this summons upon you; and if you so
fail to answer for want thereof, plain-
tiff will take judgment against you for
the relief prayed for in the complaint
on file herein, to-wit:

For an order and decree of this Court
that the defendants, and each thereof,
may be required to set forth the nature
of his or her claim in and to the fol-
lowing described real property:

Lots Sixteen (16), Seventeen
(17), Eighteen (18), Nineteen (19)
and Twenty (20), in Block Ten
(10), of the Original Townsite of
the Town of Nyssa, County of
Malheur, State of Oregon, as the
same is shown and appears on the
Revised General Map of said Town
of Nyssa, now on file in the office
of the County Clerk of said County
and State.

And that all adverse claims of said
defendants, and each thereof, may be
determined by an order and decree of
this Court.

That by a decree of this Court it be
declared, ordered and decreed that the
said plaintiff now is, and his grantors
and predecessors ever since the 2nd
day of November, 1892, have been the
owners in fee simple and in the contin-
uous possession of said real prop-
erty.

That by a decree of this Court it be
declared, ordered and decreed that the
said defendants, E. B. Clark and A. A.
Hollander, have no right, title, claim
or interest in and to said premises by
reason of said agreement of sale, de-
scribed and set forth in paragraph 3 of
the complaint on file herein, and that
said agreement of sale be cancelled,
held for naught, void and of no further
force and effect.

That by an order of this Court it be
declared, ordered and decreed that the
said defendant, J. W. Wood, has failed
and neglected to comply with the terms
of the said sales contract set forth in
paragraph 4 of said complaint, and has
failed and neglected to make the pay-
ments therein provided on his part to
be made, kept and performed, and by
reason thereof, has breached said con-
tract, and each and every of the terms
thereof, and that any right, title, claim
or interest of said defendant, J. W.
Wood in and to said real property by
reason of said sales contract, described
in paragraph 4 of said complaint, is
lost to said defendant, J. W. Wood,
and that said defendant, J. W. Wood,
has no right, title, claim or interest in
and to said land and premises, or any
part thereof, and that said sales con-
tract be cancelled, held for naught,
void and of no further force and effect.
That by a decree of this Court it be
declared, ordered and decreed that the

said defendant, E. R. Berg, has no
right, title, claim or interest in and to
said land and premises by reason of
the mortgage set forth said described
in paragraph 5 of said complaint; that
the note secured by said mortgage has
been paid; that the said mortgage be
released and the Clerk of this Court
ordered, directed and authorized to re-
lease said mortgage on the records in
his office, and that said mortgage is
not a cloud upon plaintiff's title.

That said plaintiff has a fee simple
title in and to said real property, and
every part and portion thereof, and
against said defendants, and each
thereof, and that said plaintiff's title
is good and valid.

That said defendants, and each
thereof, be forever barred and enjoined
from asserting any right, title, claim
or interest in and to said real property,
or any part thereof, adverse to plain-
tiff, and for such other and further
relief as to the Court may seem meet,

Give Cows Free Access to Water to Help Yield

Giving cows free access to water
any time they want it, increased milk
yield 6 per cent and the butter yield
12 per cent. Cows which had access
to water took a drink an average of
10.3 times in each 24 hours and drank
over 18 per cent more water than
cows which were fed exactly the same
but watered outside. These are the
results of tests conducted by C. Y.
Cannon of Iowa State college. They
indicate that there are thousands of
dairymen who could greatly increase
their profits by using drinking cups.

Dairy Facts

Water is the cheapest and one of
the most important dairy feeds, if we
can class it as a feed.

When several small calves are kept
together small stanchions are a great
convenience at feeding time.

Where skim milk is left on the farm
the raising of calves is comparatively
simple if supplemental feeds are used.

About 87 per cent of milk is water.
For plenty of milk, don't forget to give
the cow all the water she cares to
drink.

Cows give more milk if milked
three times a day instead of twice.
In observed cases the increase has
been from 10 to 25 per cent.

The life of an average woven wire
fence when posts are replaced and the
fence is restretched, is 15 to 27
years, according to estimates made by
146 Iowa farmers.

Practical Dairyman Is Admirer of Modern Barn

The modern dairy barn is as far re-
moved almost from the old cow stable
in use a third of a century ago as is
mechanical power from that furnished
by a yoke of oxen in pioneer days. A
well-ventilated, well-lighted barn
equipped with a concrete floor, ad-
justable stalls that can easily be kept
clean and in strictly sanitary condi-
tion, truly is an inspiration to the
practical dairyman. With proper ven-
tilation, not only can the foul air be
removed, but also the excess moisture
that used to accumulate in the old
stables. This means better herd health
and more economical use of feed by
the cows. Plenty of sunshine and
fresh, pure air are two of the most
important factors not only for the
health of the cow, but also for the
conversion by her of feed into milk
and butterfat.

Colostrum Is Helpful to Newborn Calves

A newborn calf should always be
given the opportunity to suck its dam
at least once so as to get the colos-
trum which nature has especially pre-
pared for it. This colostrum is laxa-
tive in character and also contains
some stimulating products which help
to start the digestive system into ac-
tivity. If for any reason it is impos-
sible to give the calf one ounce of
castor oil shortly after birth and be-
fore it is given any food. After that
the calf may be given milk from any
cow if the mother's milk is not avail-
able.

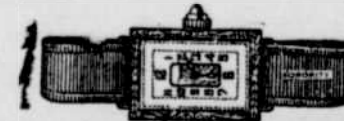
