COLLEGE PROF. SETTLES HERE

A retired teacher, with an interesting life, is R. J. Davis of Nyssa. His eyes twinkled when he told The Journal that he was born away back in 1859, on December 15, near Greensboro, North Carolina, the home of Vicks Vapo Rub. Yes, he taught school a good many years. He helped some 5000 young folks on the road to knowledge.

He taught in six states, North Carolina, Virginia, Tennessee, Mississippi, Idaho and Oregon. Nine years he was president of People's College, Pinkville, Tenn., and later at Gladesville college, Wise, Tennessee.

However, he was not the only member of the Davis family who taught school. Mrs. Davis also taught at People's college early in her career.

When Davis came west he accepted the presidency of Columbia college in

Milton, Or., then maintained by the Methodist Church South. Yes, in those days there was Methodist church representing the South and the North, divided over the slavery question as was the nation many years.

Davis came to Nyssa in 1903, along with many new settlers who believed that the Owyhee project would be under irrigation in a year or two. They came in droves to take up homestead land under the Owyhee. Davis filed on 160 acres and he has called this land his home for 23 years.

When the Owyhee needed help in congress a few years ago, Davis found a friend in Congressman S. D. McReynolds of Tennessee, a one time pupil of his. McReynolds enlisted the support of many southern congressmen.

During the years the Owyhee was in balance, Davis found variety in teaching school, in Nyssa and elsewhere. He finds that he is not now far removed from his profession as he is superintendent of the Nyssa Sunday school.

He and Mrs. Davis have two children, Don D. of San Francisco, and Mrs. Arthur Cockrum of Ontario. They have three grandchildren.

Along with other oldtimes of Nyssa, Davis has been a friend of the Owyhee many years. He is still actively serving, being secretary of the advisory board of the Owyhee project.

STATE POLICE BILL BECOMES LAW; MEIER APPOINTS NEW CHIEF

The act creating the new state police bill became operative August 1 as was provided by the state legislature, while the legislative appropriation for the higher institutions of Oregon will be submitted to a vote of the people November, 1932. The referendum movement against the police act failed by 1219 names while the one against the \$1,182,000 appropriation for Oregon colleges was successful, with a total of 13,585 names. The statute required 10,680 names.

Ed Averill, sponsor of the move against the police bill, admitted defeat Friday when upstate petitions failed to come up to advance reports.

Chas. P. Pray of Oswego, state patrol officer, has been appointed the new superintendent of state police, Governor Meier announced Saturday.
