**Ask Routing
 Of I. O. N.**

Almost unanimously, with but one dissenting vote, the Malheur County Pomona grange passed a resolution as its last session in Big Bend, requesting the designation of the I. O. N. from McDermitt to Nyssa and allocation of Oregon's appropriation under the Oddie-Colton bill for early construction.

For publication the first time in a Malheur county newspaper, copy of the resolution was forwarded The Journal Monday with the request that it be published. It sets forth facts which should be of interest throughout Malheur county.

"To Hon. Julius L. Meier, Governor of The State of Oregon and The Hon. State Highway Commission of the State of Oregon:

"Whereas; economic conditions are such that for producers to operate at even a small profit it is incumbent upon them to secure the highest available market prices for their products, and,

"Whereas; the State of California is now in a position where her consumption of many products is greater than production and is seeking many products from outside territory, and becomes a very remunerative market for Oregon, and Western Idaho, and

"Whereas; the State of California and Nevada have under construction a market highway which will be fully completed this fall to McDermitt, Nevada, on the boundary line between Malheur County, Oregon, and the State of Nevada, and

"Whereas; the building of a market road from McDermitt to Jordan Valley and the completion of the market road from Jordan Valley to Nyssa, Oregon, would place the products of Malheur County, Oregon, and Western Idaho several hundred miles nearer the great market centers of the bay region and Southern California than the shortest possible railroad and 145 miles nearer than by any other highway now constructed, under construction, or any other possible route, and

"Whereas; practically all of a road from McDermitt to Jordan Valley would be over a government domain and also a considerable portion of the road from Jordan Valley to Nyssa, Oregon and can be built from Federal funds under the provisions of the Oddie-Colton Law, and

"Whereas; there is now under construction in Malheur County, Oregon, and Canyon County, Idaho, the Owyhee Irrigation project and the Vale project, which will be completed within the next five years, bringing under cultivation some 120,000 acres of new land, and

"Whereas; the success of said projects will much depend upon a remunerative market for the products of their fertile soil, and

Whereas, the State of Oregon is now paying interest on the bonded indebtedness of the Jordan Valley Irrigation District, and

"Whereas; the construction of the market highway as herein described would also place the products of this district much nearer the remunerative market centers and enable it thereby to become more nearly self-supporting, and

"Whereas; Senator Oddie of Nevada, who was more than any other man responsible for the enacting of the Oddie-Colton bill into law has stated that the primary purpose of the bill was the construction of this road connecting the States of Idaho, Oregon and Nevada with California, and

"Whereas; so long as the link between McDermitt and Nyssa, remains uncompleted the purposes of the Oddie-Colton law are not being fully realized as intended, and

"Whereas; because of the above facts as set forth and various other reasons there is a constantly increasing demand for the building of said highway at the earliest possible time,

"Therefore be it Resolved by the Malheur County, Pomona Grange that, The Honorable Governor of the State of Oregon and the Honorable State Highway Commission of the State of Oregon be urged to designate the road between the towns of McDermitt, Nevada, and Nyssa, Oregon, as a part of the Oregon State and National Highway system and that a portion of the funds allotted to the State of Oregon under the Oddie-Colton law, be allocated to the building of the said highway."
