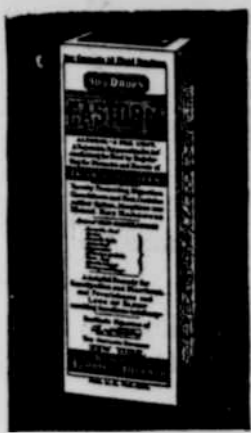


BRADLEYS GIVE DINNER PARTY AT OWYHEE HOME
