THE COUNTRY MERCHANT

Few people realize the great amount of credit that is due the small town merchant and business man.

Can you imagine city merchants digging down into their pockets to aid rural communities, regardless of the fact that they are keen after the country trade?

A NEW DEAL FOR THE PUBLIC

The old rule of "let the buyer beware" has been changed to "let the seller beware," not by a jury's decision but by a changed public attitude.

Last week a jury convicted Frank J. Keller, Jr., of formulating a scheme to defraud in connection with the sale of stock in the Empire Holding company, which it is said has cost some Oregon investors several hundred thousand dollars. The jury took the stand that parties who form corporations and sell stock to the public are to be held to strict accountability "to obey the letter and spirit of the corporation laws of Oregon and also to a high ethical conception of trusteeship."

The jury held that in permitting officers to qualify who had not invested the money collected in expenses incurred in attempting to put over the Empire Holding company, leaving almost nothing to be invested in the business, that the defendant Mr. Keller failed to live up to the obligation he assumed in becoming connected with the proposition.

It is to be regretted that other prominent men of Oregon, who, perhaps had no intention to defraud, were also associated. It is a good thing, however, to be assured that the Oregon laws, for the protection of its citizenry in connection with the buying and selling of stock, are laws which will be enforced to the letter. The public is gullible and should be so protected.
