Frank Hanna and John Cannon attended festivities at Juntura the 4th. Wayne Hyde and family celebrated at Vale.

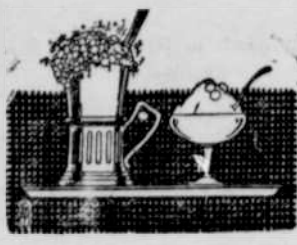
Warren McHaruge is barber in his shop in town this week, as Roy Pounds is on vacation.
