THE HOME CORNER

FROZEN PEACH CREAM

- 2 cups peach pulp
- Juice from 1-2 lemon
- 1 cup sugar
- 1 cup whipping cream
- 1 cup thin cream.
- 1 tsp. vanilla.

Add lemon juice and sugar to the peach pulp. Add cream and vanilla and pour into freezer. Freezer using 3 parts ice to 1 of salt. When frozen remove

dasher, pack in salt and ice and let stand 3 to 4 hours. This cream may be frozen in an electrical refrigerator tray by the following method: Soak 1 tablespoon of gelatin in 3 tablespoons of cold water for 5 minutes. Dissolve over hot water and add to the sweetened peach pulp. When slightly thickened add thin cream and fold in the whipped cream. Add vanilla and pour into the refrigerator tray and freeze 2 to 4 hours.

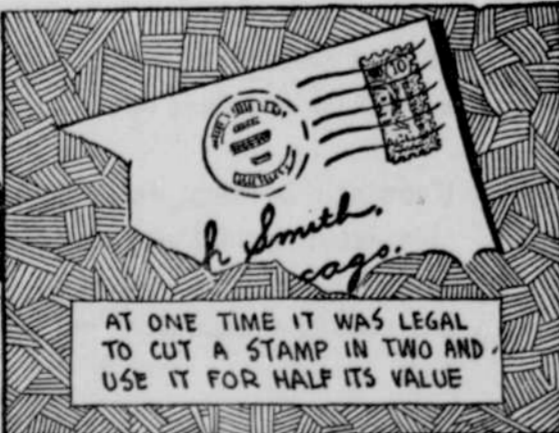
