

Dr. Mead Favors Help For Needy Districts; Brogan May Get Project

A statement from Dr. Elwood Mead, federal commissioner of reclamation, definitely favoring federal aid in rehabilitating existing reclamation projects, has just been received by Dr. W. L. Powers, secretary of the Oregon Reclamation congress and chief in soils at Oregon State college. Dr. Powers believes such a move may result in aid for Brogan orchard lands in Malheur county.

Dr. Mead will address the annual meeting of the Oregon Reclamation congress, dates for which have been set for October 6 and 7, with Bend the tentative meeting place. Dr. Mead is expected to discuss the subject there.

Federal aid in preventing the disintegration of existing feasible projects has been advocated for years by the reclamation congress, which has backed a three-fold program of physical rehabilitation of designated projects, supplemental water supplies where needed, and refinancing on a basis of productive value over a long period of time at moderate interest rates.

West Vitality Concerned
"The present situation is one which

primarily concerns the west," Dr. Mead wrote, "and which can be improved only by the active influence of an informed and aroused public opinion. Irrigation works in many valleys need to be reconstructed. The needs involve expenditures many times the yearly income of the reclamation fund. Farmers cannot raise the money to replace worn-out structures or design and build costly reservoirs.

"Farmers now grow more valuable crops than ever before. They require intense culture and more water for late irrigation. It is to meet such situations that the bureau is called on, not for plans to reclaim more new land but to work out schemes to protect and preserve other developments.

"Any proposal to provide additional funds for reclamation is met by opposition which seeks to place an embargo on all further conservation of water for irrigation," said Dr. Mead. "This attitude comes from a mistaken belief that the main result of the works desired would be to add new land to the cultivated area and increase agricultural surplus. What is sought is to preserve farms already established.

"If help is to be extended to the present generation of farmers, then the reclamation income ought to be much larger. If increased funds were available, the nation would be helped by greater economic prosperity and the increased markets for manufactured goods which would result."
