APPLE VALLEY CUTS DOWN SCHOOL COSTS

Apple Valley—According to the annual financial report of the Apple Valley school district, the cost of operation of the school decreased from \$12,700.43 in 1930 to \$9,569.36 for the 1932 session. Economies were effected by a lower salary scale, the elimination of one teacher and by sending high school students to Parma.

The total cost for the 1931 term was \$11,787.02, which included an item of \$1,198.30 for building repairs, reported F. W. Osterkamp, clerk. He stated that in spite of decrease in cost of the school operation, the high standard of the Apple Valley school has been maintained.

Rancher Finds Old Powder Horn Near McDermitt

McDermitt—George Harper, owner of the isolated Battle creek ranch 30 miles north of McDermitt, found another memoir of the early west when he picked up an ancient case for carrying shot called a "Perdigone," or powder flask. It is made of bronze with brass and copper top and is polished and shiny with years. It is about 5 inches long and is nicely carved and decorated.

Old timers say the powder flask may be more than 200 years old. They recall that a polished cow horn was also used for a powder flask.

Mr. Harper and others of the McDermitt section have observed another interesting memoir of early days near the Battle creek ranch house. It is Indian sign writing on the cliffs. One section indicates soldiers with military equipment and a fort, believed to have been a warning to the tribes or a map showing the location of the white men.
